Georgetown Legion donate \$1,000 for talking books

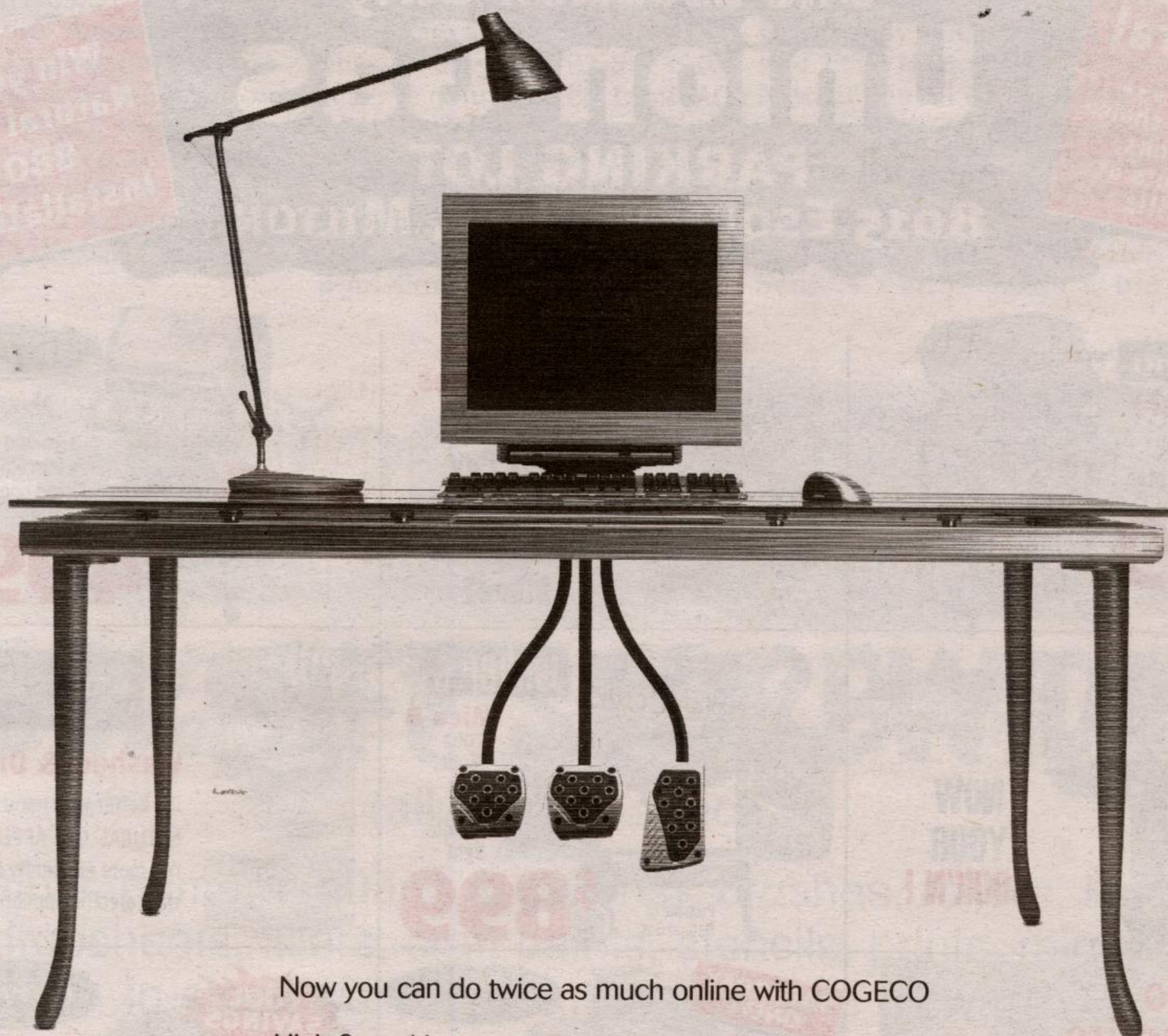
