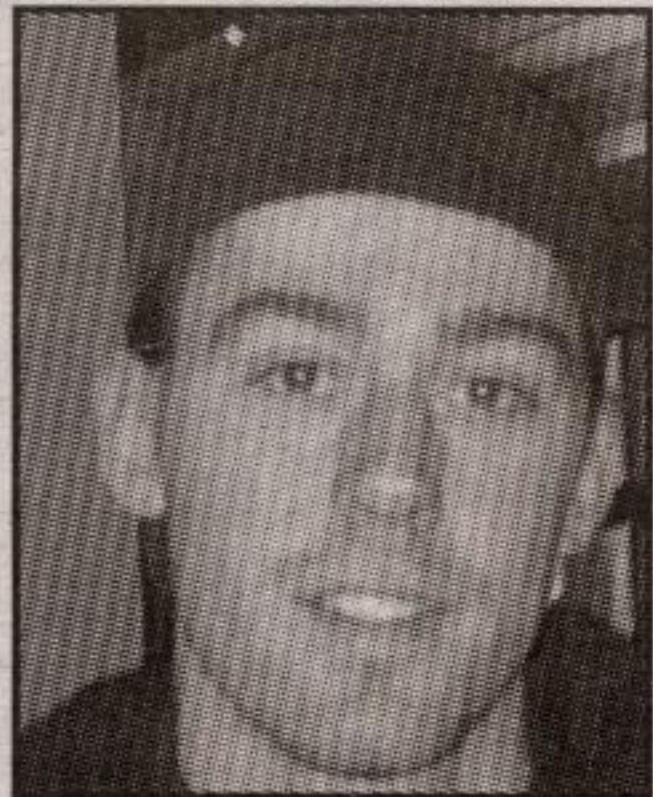

Tax hike not as severe as first thought

As a result of revised numbers at Halton Region, Halton Hills taxpayers will be paying less taxes in 2002.

The combined education, town and region tax bill is now an overall 2.4 per cent

increase, a drop from 3 per cent. The change results from updated regional assessment numbers that changed its budget increase from 3.1 to 1.8 per cent. The town's tax increase of 5.9 per cent remains unchanged.
