NOTICE OF PUBLIC INFORMATION SESSION AND PRELIMINARY HEARING

In the matter of five appeals by The Regional Municipality of Halton filed between March 4, 2002 and March 18, 2002 for a hearing before the Environmental Review Tribunal pursuant to Section 100 of the *Ontario Water Resources Act* with respect to Certificates of Approval issued by the Director, Ministry of the Environment, under Section 52 of the *Ontario Water Resources Act*, regarding groundwater supply systems serving: the Georgetown community in the Town of Halton Hills in the Regional Municipality of Halton located at Princess Anne Wells, Lot 9, Concession 8, Halton Hills Town, Regional Municipality of Halton, (Certificate of Approval #2196-543M611); the Town of Oakville in the Regional Municipality of Halton located at Oakville Water Purification Plant, 21 Kerr Street, Oakville Town, Regional Municipality of Halton (Certificate of Approval #8570-56UKCY); the Town of Milton in the Regional Municipality of Halton, located at Kelso Well Field, Lot 5, Concession 7 and Walkers Line Well Field, Lot 13, Concession 4, Milton Town, Regional Municipality of Halton, (Certificate of Approval #9945-53YK9V); the Village of Campbellville located at Campbellville Well Field, Lot 5, 6, Concession 4, Nassaggiweya, Milton Town, Municipality of Halton (Certificate of Approval #9092-53YJUS); and Acton, located at Davidson Well Nos. 1 and 2, Acton Well System, Town of Halton Hills, Regional Municipality of Halton, Ontario (Certificate of Approval #3183-57DKM2).

The Ministry of the Environment issued, under the *Ontario Water Resources Act*, new Certificates of Approval to operate municipal water works across the Province.

The purpose of this hearing is to enable the Tribunal to determine whether it shall confirm, alter or revoke the Director's Certificate of Approval issued for the sites noted above.

Public Information Meeting:

In order to advise the public of its hearing process, the Environmental Review Tribunal is conducting Public Information Meetings at various locations across the Province.

A member of the Tribunal's staff will conduct a Public Information Meeting on **Monday, June 10, 2002 at 7:00 p.m.** in the Glenorchy/Dakota Room, The Regional Municipality of Halton, 1151 Bronte Road, Oakville, Ontario. The purpose of this Public Information Meeting will be to provide groups or individuals with information on the hearing process and the different ways in which they can participate in the Hearing; to provide an opportunity for those with similar interests to discuss their issues and concerns amongst themselves to see if an umbrella group could be formed to represent their common interests at the Hearing; to compile a list of potential Parties; Participants and Presenters; and to answer any other questions the public may have. At this session, staff will not hear any evidence and are not empowered to make decisions or rulings related to the issues of the case.

Preliminary Hearing:

A Preliminary Hearing (which will form part of the Hearing) will be held **Tuesday, June 11, 2002 at 9:30 a.m.** in the Glenorchy/Dakota room, The Regional Municipality of Halton, 1151 Bronte Road, Oakville, Ontario, and will be conducted by a member of the Tribunal. The purpose of the Preliminary Hearing will be to receive submissions from groups and individuals who are seeking Party or Participant status and to rule thereon; to identify the preliminary issues to be considered at the main Hearing; to establish the pre-hearing process (information and document exchange, meetings of Parties and their legal and technical representatives, scoping of issues, planning of the main Hearing), to deal with any other preliminary matters that may be raised by Participants and Parties; establish dates for the main Hearing and to finalize and issue Procedural Directions. **The Tribunal has selected a central location for conducting preliminary hearings for several appeals in your general area; however, the main hearing will be held in the municipality where the water works is located.**

How You Can Participate:

Groups or individuals interested in participating in the Hearing may express either their private concerns/views or their concerns/views regarding the public interest. They may participate as either a Presenter, Participant or Party. A Presenter may make a statement to the Tribunal, either orally or in writing. A Participant may make a statement to the Tribunal, either orally and/or in writing, may receive copies of all documents relied upon by the Parties, and attend site visits. Normally a Participant is expected to attend every day of the Hearing. A Party assumes the rights and responsibilities of this fullest form of involvement in the hearing process. Parties are usually represented at the Hearing by legal counsel or an agent. The Tribunal will consider requests for Party and Participant status at the Preliminary Hearing. **Anyone who wishes to participate in the Hearing should attend the Public Information Meeting and the Preliminary Hearing.**

Important:

Any person who wishes to participate in the Hearing as a Party or Participant **must** notify the Tribunal Secretary in writing (or electronically) by **4:00 p.m. on May 31, 2002.** Contact the Tribunal Secretary for further details. Additional information about the Tribunal and its process can be obtained from the Tribunal's website at www.ert.gov.on.ca.

There will be no court reporting services provided by the Tribunal for the hearing. If Parties consider that they may require a transcript of the proceedings they may, with the Tribunal's approval, obtain such service at their own expense.

If you require the assistance of a French language interpreter, or any other assistance, please advise the Tribunal Secretary as soon as you receive this notice, and the Tribunal will attempt to accommodate your needs.

TAKE NOTICE that this hearing date is **peremptory** to all Parties. If you do not attend at this hearing and identify yourself to the Tribunal, the Environmental Review Tribunal may proceed in your absence and you may not receive any further notice in these proceedings.
