The two longstanding independent full-service agencies will merge effective June 1. Combined, they will be the largest travel agency in Halton Hills.

Beeline, operated by Melitta Hannon, has been in business since 1988 on Main St. in downtown Georgetown, while Roos Vision Travel opened in 1974 and has grown to 19 offices across Canada.

"This merger adds a whole new dimension to what we already have here," said Herma Buchanan of Roos Vision Travel. "It adds Melitta's and her staff's experience to what the Roos staff already has. This means as a bigger company we have better buying power, which means better savings for our customers."

Hannon of Beeline agrees.

"This is a very positive story," she said. "We're very excited to move in so that we become bigger and better, with more resources, technology, and special savings to offer our clients."

The merger makes good economic sense in this service industry, said Buchanan. Rather than competing with

each other in this growing community, the two are now sharing resources and staff expertise. Beeline's staff of three will move to the Roos' state-of-the-art building on Guelph St. (beside Tim Horton's) to join its staff of 10.

"Different agents have expertise in different areas, so if someone has more of an expertise in something, we can draw from

each other," said Hannon, pointing out she has an expertise in Australia, while Buchanan has experience traveling throughout China.

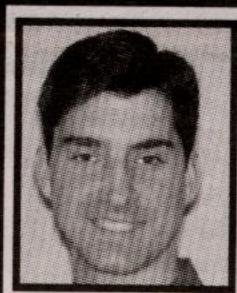
"Similarly with the rest of our staff. We got some people who are experts in the Caribbean, and others on Disney, while others have cruised on 30 different cruises. So if someone comes in, we can say 'okay who's been here, done this, and can tell us more about it'. Isn't that the best kind of knowledge there is?," explained Buchanan.

Eventually once the recognition factor has been established, both Roos and Beeline names will be dropped and the company will be known simply as Vision Travel.

SECOND HAND **SMOKE INCREASES** EAR INFECTIONS IN CHILDREN

Ear infections are the Number One reason young children visit their doctors and take antibiotics. A new study finds many of those infections could be avoided if parents who smoke would make one important change.

A recent study in the archives of pediatric and adolescent medicine is giving parents another reason to quit. It finds exposure to cigarette smoke in the home increases children's risk of middle ear infections. The smoke inflames the tissues of the middle ear so that viruses and bacteria can invade more easily and cause infection.

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
