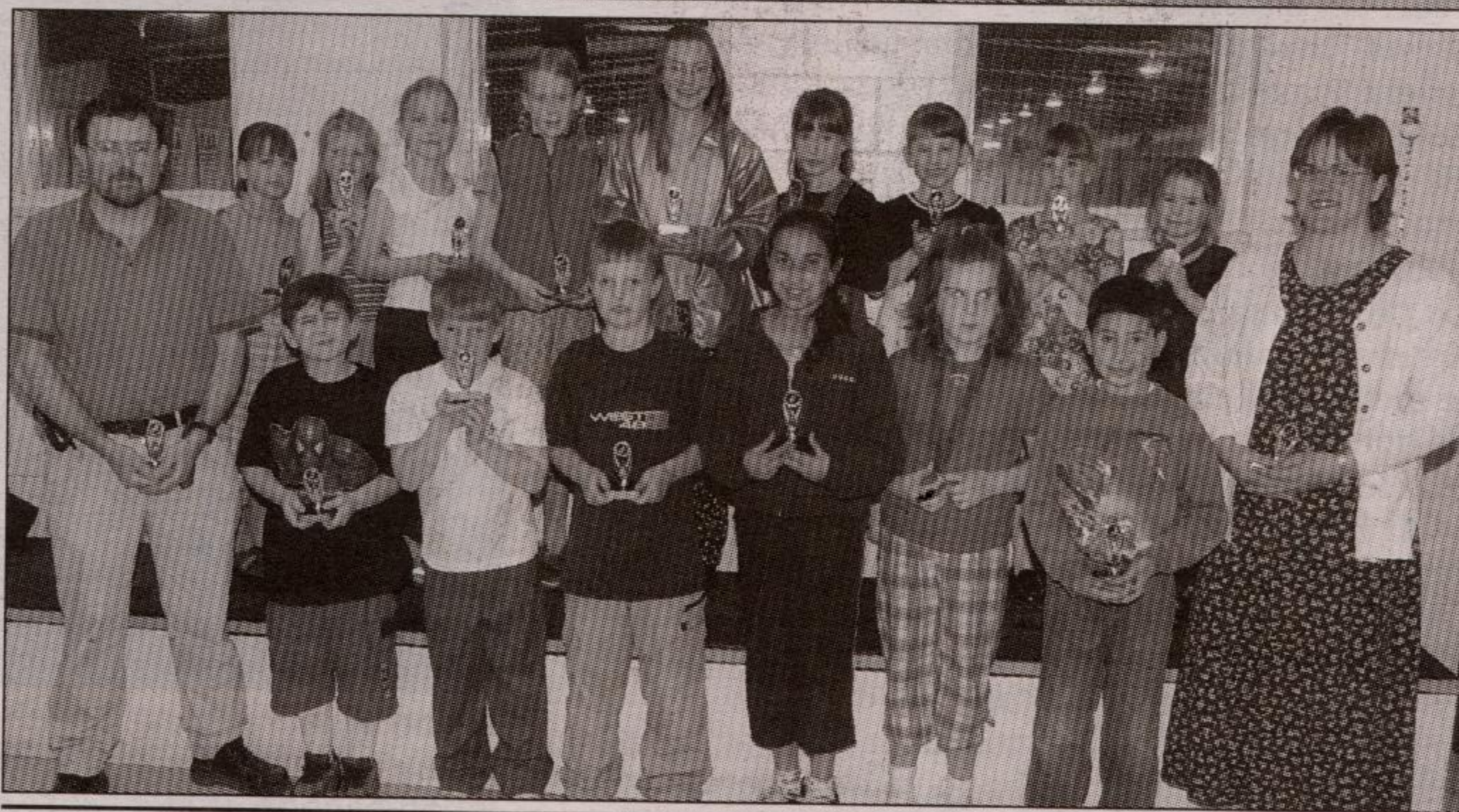
Acton's Troy Ethier placed third in the junior boys triple jump (11.64m).
