## Greenwell wins national golf title

obbie Greenwell made it a clean sweep for George-

Two weeks after his North Halton clubmate Gavin Aldridge won the Canadian Junior Golf Association's national match play title, Greenwell posted a convincing seven-stroke victory in the CJGA's National Canadian Junior Championship.

Greenwell's four-day total of 289 at the St. Andrews Valley Golf Course in Aurora was highlighted by a four-under-par 68 in the second round. Greenwell burned up the back nine that day with five birdies and four pars on the back nine and capped off the tournament's best round by chipping in for birdie on the 18th hole.

"My long game was really good. There were a lot of shots that were long irons off the tee and I kept those in the fairways." Greenwell said. "I was hitting a lot of greens and I wasn't forcing myself to make a lot of putts."


After a windy and rainy opening round, Greenwell trailed by three shots after shooting a 73. His round of 68 created a six-shot swing as he took the lead by three. After posting another 73 on the third day, Greenwell had pulled away to lead by nine.

With the wind and rain returning for the final round, Greenwell shot a 75 but he was too far ahead to catch.

"All four days I played well enough to shoot under par," Greenwell said. "I hit a couple of bad shots and I didn't make many putts, especially the last day. It poured the whole day and I had trouble with the pace of the greens."

His margin of victory may have been even greater had it not been for a double bogey on the final hole of the tournament.

"Eighteen was a really tough hole," he said. "You had to hit over water and there was a huge bunker. It's one of the scariest holes I've played."

The 16-year-old won his division (14-16) by nine strokes over Dong Kyu Kim of Mississauga and received the Esquire Excellence Award as the overall winner. Clinton Rayfield, 18, of Coldwater was his closest competitor at 296.


