Performing this weekend at the McGibbon

Local man issues tribute song to ailing Rompin' Ronnie Hawkins

Cotton has released a tribute CD to Rompin' Ronnie Hawkins, and will be performing it during a gig at the McGibbon Hotel this weekend.

Neil Cotton and Hawk's Nest performs Friday and Saturday at the McGibbon Hotel, and will be among the artists performing at a Terry Fox cancer benefit at Healey's Bar in Toronto next Sunday afternoon (Sept. 8).

Cotton, a longtime fan of Hawkins, wrote the song, The Mayor of Old Yonge Street, in the late 1990s as a tribute to "The Hawk". The lyrics were recently posted on a Web site. At the same time, Hawkins was recovering in hospital from a removal of a cancerous tumor, and a friend read the lyrics to him. According to Cotton, Hawkins was speechless and that, combined with positive messages from the Web site, encouraged Cotton to record the song this month.

Hawk's Nest, a country rock band has four members; Cotton (guitar, harmonica, lap steel and vocals), Gary Creary (lead guitar and vocals), Paul Gardiner (bass guitar and vocals) and Robert Porter (drums).

The group covers artists like Waylon Jennings, Merle Haggard, Johnny Rivers, Alabama, Johnny Cash, Eric Clapton, Alan Jackson, Nitty Gritty Dirt Band, The Beatles and The Band.

The band is named after the old Hawkins

bar on Yonge Street in Toronto. In the late 1980s Cotton and Creary were in a band that opened a Hawkins' show.

The CD includes The Mayor of Old Yonge Street, Migratory Snowbirds, King of the Swamp, Sharing My Thoughts, Why Are You Leaving, Feel The Train, Hard To Fight Temptation, Drink Don't Heal, Geriatric Gypsy, and Give Half The Song To Me.
