Region reviewing Official Plan

This autumn, Halton Region is embarking on the review of the region's Official Plan.

The Plan outlines the goals and policies that we use to help manage physical change and its effects on the social, economic and natural environment in the region.

Halton Region's first Official Plan was approved in 1980 by the Minister of Municipal Affairs. It was reviewed in the early 1990's, resulting in the second Official Plan, which was approved by the minister in March 1995.

A number of studies have already been completed focusing on Halton's natural heritage areas, including Significant Woodlands, Environmentally Sensitive Areas, Significant Wetlands and Areas of Natural and Scientific Interest. These documents are available for review on the region's Web site at www.region.halton.on.ca.

A directions report detailing proposed changes to the Official Plan will be released this September. The directions report will highlight current planning issues in Halton, stimulate public discussion about a future vision for the region and will look at options for achieving these goals.

A comprehensive public consultation program will be implemented in the coming months to ensure all stakeholders in Halton's
