


In the following WMUs, a limited number of additional game seals are available for use during either the firearm or archery season: 63B, 64A, 64B, 82A, 82B.

From September 9 – 20, hunters may purchase an additional seal by telephone only at 1-800-387-7011 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday to Friday. Purchasers must have a valid hunting version Outdoors Card. Cost of the additional seal is \$33.00. All sales are on a first come, first served basis.

Starting on September 23, any remaining game seals will be sold at the Ministry of Natural Resources office administering the hunt in that WMU.
