

# Register Sunday for Hoops action

The Erin Hoops Basketball program will be holding registration on Sunday, September 15 from 1:45-3 p.m. at the Centre 2000 gym, 14 Boland Drive in Erin.

Age groups start as young as Kinderball for 4-6-year-olds, and progress through to 13-15 or 16-18 depending on the number of registrants. Adults can also play in Adult Pickup Ball on Tuesday evenings starting in September from 8-10 p.m., with both male and female players welcome. Players can join the youth programs for \$40 and adults can register for \$45. A family rate of \$100 for three or more players makes the program available to everyone.

Youth programs run for 90 minutes every Saturday. Each group is split into teams and every Saturday coaches provide instruction in a different area of play, then the players are

given the opportunity to showcase what they've learned in games.

For girls 13-17, Hoops also runs the Wellington Warriors, a competitive Ontario Basketball Association Juvenile team. This team competes in various tournaments throughout the season finishing with the provincial championships in May. This is the only competitive team operating in Hoops but if interested players come forward in future other teams may be formed.

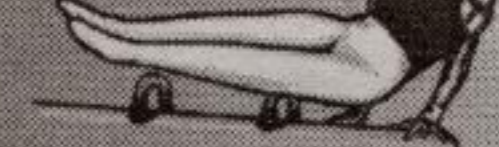
