
skills, whether you are a beginner or have some experience. I took one of the courses, and it was excellent. When you write the test to get your M1 licence, no actual riding experience is required before you get on that bike that you have just purchased. There is no experienced driver next to you to give advice. The course will give you the advice that you need in advance.

I have one important piece of advice to give motorcycle riders. You are not invincible! If you cut in and out of traffic, ride up the shoulder or the centre lane, speed, or do any of those other things that irritate other drivers, eventually you will hurt yourself. Your actions will also reflect on all riders. Remember, there are two types of people who ride motorcycles: Those who have fallen off, and those who are going to fall off. (I belong to the first group!) Even out your odds and ride sensibly. Perform shoulder checks, and make sure to signal.

Here is the part for car drivers. Motorcycles are motor vehicles too. They are entitled to their own lane space, so when you see a motorcycle taking up a portion of the lane, you cannot squeeze in next to them, or pass them in the unused portion of their lane. If you see a motorcycle give it some extra space.
