

Five new officers assigned to town

Halton Regional Police Service has announced the appointment of five new officers who will patrol Halton Hills.

Constables Colin Van Den Tillaart, Christine McKenzie, Alex Smith, Chris Borak and John Ivey have been assigned to One District in Georgetown.

Van Den Tillaart was born and raised in Campbellford and graduated from the police foundations program at Loyalist College in 2001.

McKenzie was born in Toronto and raised in Collingwood. She obtained her police foundations diploma in Toronto after graduating from the University of Guelph in 1999 with an associate diploma in agriculture.

Born in Halifax, Smith joined the Metro Toronto Police Service in 1989 and has

worked in a variety of positions at 54 Division. He was issued an award from the province for bravery and courage in the line of duty and was awarded letters of recognition and commendation from the Toronto police chief.

Borak was born in Florida and raised in Mississauga and continued his post-secondary education at Trent University. He has volunteered with the Halton Regional Auxiliary Police.

Ivey, a native of Port Dover, continued his post-secondary education at Seneca College where he obtained a diploma with high honours distinction in outdoor recreation. At the University of Guelph he obtained a degree in criminal justice and public policy and while attending the Ontario Police College earned the sportsmanship award.

"It's a pleasure to grant the blessings of Christ to his children at both those congregations."

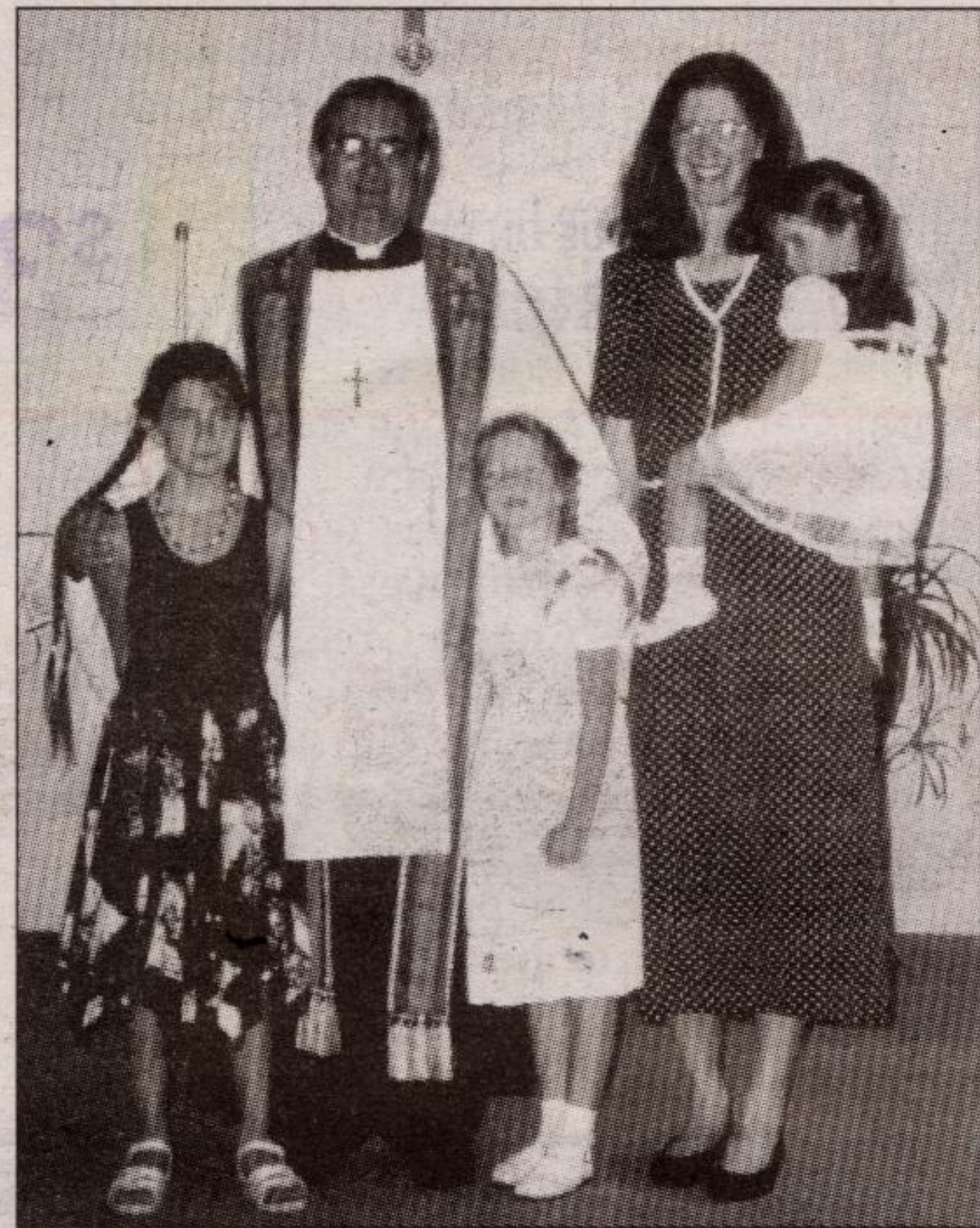
This is a second career for Bryans, who for 10 years was an architect, as was his wife, before he became a pastor.

The Town of Caledon is considering a by-law to amend the Town of Caledon Sign By-law 94-14. The purpose of the Sign By-law is to regulate signs or other advertising devices with respect to their location, construction materials, size, permit requirements etc. Following the public meeting, the proposed by-law will be brought to Town Council for consideration and adoption.

The proposed amendments will address:

- Sign area of commercial ground signs;
- Location of election signs;
- Sign area and location of development signage;
- Location and size of religious or philanthropic signs;
- Changes to permit fees; and
- Changes to the procedures related to the removal of illegal signs.
