# Morrison eyes national title

Tith two provincial titles under his belt, Spencer Morrison is setting his sights on a national championship.

Morrison, a midfielder on the Oakville Winstars, helped his team edge the East York Komets 3-2 in overtime to win the Ontario Cup U-14 championship. The victory sends them into the Canadian championships in Kelowna, B.C. as the number one seed.

After winning their pool, the Winstars posted an impressive 7-2 victory over Thunder Bay in the quarterfinals, then blanked South Nepean 1-0 in the semifinals.

In the final, the Winstars were tied 2-2 with East York in overtime when Oakville's Adam Cannell kicked the ball toward the opposition net. Morrison charged hard toward the net, which briefly drew the keeper's attention, allowing Cannell's shot to get by for the winning goal.

It was the second Ontario Cup


title for Morrison, who won the Under-12 championship as a member of the Burlington Bulldogs two years ago. He said that experience helped him in this year's tourna-

Still, Morrison said this year's victory was much tougher because of the skill level of the teams they faced. The Winstars have had a successful season, winning the Woodbridge Invitational Showcase Tournament and making it to the semifinals of the Robbie International Tournament.

They'll hope to keep their winning ways going when they open the nationals October 10 against New Brunswick. Oakville will then face Prince Edward Island two days later.
