Big and small we have them all.... The Upper Credit Humane Society has some dogs up for adoption including:

Molly: German Shepherd, female black/tan, five years old, house-trained, would be better in a country home with adults, loving and loves attention.

Toto: Shepherd/Husky cross neutered male, black/tan, one year old, housebroken, loves people and most dogs.

Tigger: Black Lab cross, spayed female, black and about 65 lbs, very friendly with people/dogs, quite independent, clean, quiet and well behaved but DOES NOT LIKE CATS.

Ben: Foxhound, male, four years old, approx 50 lbs, very playful disposition, lively, likes people and other dogs.

Martha: Red Chow, female, approximately three years old, good temperament, quiet, independent, loves to cuddle, just a sweetheart!

Bailey: Beagle, eight months old neutered, not fully house-trained, affectionate, loves to be heard.

Spitzi: Pomeranian cross, male, seven years old, neutered, loves being held by adults, needs a family without small children as he might nip, very dog aggressive to strange dogs. Is newspaper trained. Loves to be with his person and follows you around.

Sin-Sin: Chihuahua short-haired under five, female, spayed; enjoys being carried, snuggled and pampered, very outgoing, newspaper trained.

Mud: Hound cross, compact, predominantly white with beige markings. Young dog not leash trained so needs training. Very happy and energetic. He is very clean called Mud because it is tattooed in his ear.

Copper: Yellow Lab, two years old, 72 lbs, house-trained, needs to be only dog in family, needs training for insecurity with family visitors, fine with people he knows.

Cleo: Shepherd/Husky cross, an older dog, approximately eight years old, returned to us because family suffering from allergies. Needs a quiet loving home.

Special needs dog: Rescued from euthanasia; Glory, 45 lbs black and tan looks like a small Rottie cross was found to have glaucoma. This necessitated removal of one eye, and drops daily in the remaining one for the rest of her life. Glory is about five years old, clean in the house, and likes to be near you as much as possible. This dog is amazingly hardy and still loves life and likes to walk but would need a secure yard, as her eyesight is impaired.

Upper Credit Humane Society serves a wide area to protect animals

The Upper Credit Humane Society (UCHS) serves a large area, including Halton Hills.

The original name of the UCHS was the Erin, Hillsburgh and District Humane Society. It was founded as a branch of the Ontario Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (OSPCA) in 1991. The founding members were a group of local citizens concerned about the welfare of animals. In 1995, the name was changed to Upper Credit Humane Society (UCHS) and the Society became an independent affiliate of the OSPCA. Operations of the UCHS are overseen by an elected board of directors.

The towns served by the UCHS are Halton Hills, Erin (includes canine control), Caledon (west of Hwy. 10); Eramosa, and East Garafaxa.

Its mission is:

- To protect animals in need by offering food, water, shelter and medical attention
- To find suitable homes for unwanted or unclaimed animals
- To develop and promote, through education and public awareness, the humane treatment of all animals
- To return native wildlife to its natural habitat when possible
- To prevent cruelty to animals, birds, and fish by assisting in the enforcement of animal protection laws
- To raise the funds necessary to achieve these objectives

The UCHS relies solely on public and cor-

porate donations, legacies and fund-raising campaigns to carry out its work. Each year the UCHS must raise sufficient funds to maintain important programs.

At the same time, the group been working towards building a shelter at Brisbane Corners in Erin (corner of Trafalgar Rd. N and Hwy. 24). This spot was chosen as it is in the middle of its large serviced area. With the continued help of its supporters, UCHS is hoping to accomplish this goal by the end of 2002.

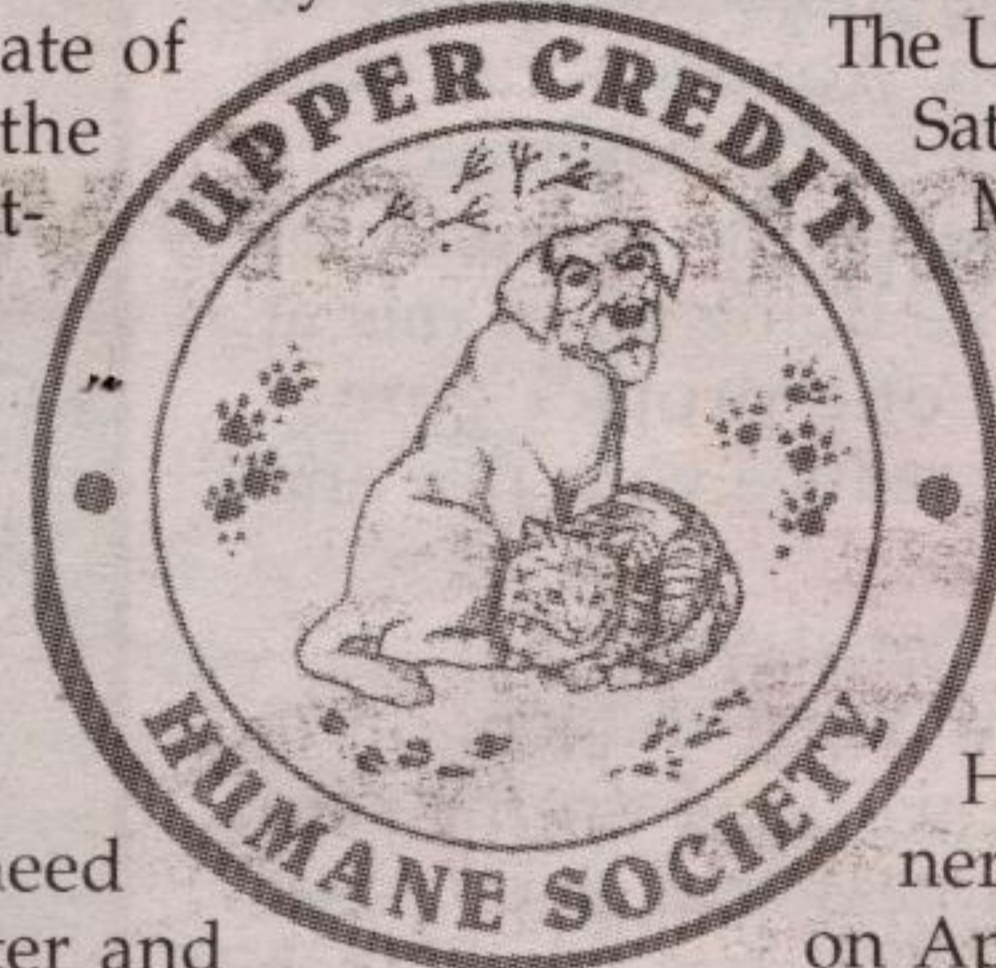
How can you help?

The UCHS is holding a Rabies Clinic on Saturday, Oct. 26 at the Lions Hall, 43 Mill St. in Georgetown, between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. at a cost of \$15/animal. This is your chance to give your animal his vaccination and support the Humane Society.
