

October 6, 2002

This work will continue for approximately three more weeks.

Our 2002 Watermain Cleaning Program will cover the areas bounded by Maple Avenue, Guelph Street, and Hall Road, to include Norval, and Georgetown South. And also the industrial area north of Guelph Street between Mountainview Road and Delrex Boulevard.

There may be some inconveniences to you during our operation, either when we are physically on your street, or even in your general area. Discoloured water is discharged during cleaning and to avoid having it enter your home/place of business please follow the steps noted below:

- Do not use water between the times indicated on your BLUE LETTER, which we
 will provide to you approximately 2 days prior to working on your street.
- When we are finished for the day on your street (times indicated in the BLUE LETTER) please turn on the cold water tap in your basement and let it run until the water is clear.

To keep informed of our progress, look for advertisements in this newspaper and look for our **BLUE LETTER** in your mailbox for the dates we'll be working on your street.



DEVELOPMENT CHARGE BY-LAW NON-RESIDENTIAL DISCOUNT POLICY PUBLIC MEETING

The Development Charges Advisory Committee has met regularly with staff and consultants since June 2001 to examine the costs and benefits of providing reductions/exemptions for non-residential development charges. The results of the analyses are provided in "The Halton Development Charge Background Study for the Review of the Non-Residential Development Charges Discount Policies." This study will be available from Halton Region on October 29th at the numbers listed below.

Halton Regional Council recently endorsed a staff recommendation to eliminate the 25 per cent retail development charge discount and reduce the industrial/ commercial discount from 50 per cent to 25 per cent. The reduction to the non-residential development charge discounts requires an amendment to By-law 117-99.

The Development Charges Act requires that at least one public meeting be held prior to the passing of a development charges by-law, or any amendments to the by-law.

Interested persons should note that the development charge proposals may change as a result of the meeting and any further staff reports. The final proposal and By-law to amend Development Charge By-law 117-99 will be presented to Administration & Finance Committee at its regular meeting of Wednesday, January 15, 2003 at 1:30 p.m. in the Halton Room. The final By-law amendment will be presented to Council for approval on Wednesday, January 22, 2003 at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.
