Last chance for tickets to Leahy Bach Chorale to host dler Frank Leahy will perform two trio of intimate concerts

This fall, the Georgetown Bach Chorale has a series of three concerts planned featuring chamber and orchestral music as well as the choral work that forms the cornerstone of its performances.

The Georgetown Bach Chorale, founded in 1999, is a small chamber choir performing a classical repertoire both a capella and with instrumental accompaniment, always with special emphasis on the works of Johann Sebastian Bach.

The first, Feuilles d'automne, a musical reflection on the change of seasons, is a chamber concert with violin, cello and piano. The musicians will be performing in the intimate surroundings of a private home, 157 Main St. S, with a reception to follow. Due to the popularity of this event, the Bach Chorale has decided to extend this performance over two nights, Friday, Nov. 1 and Saturday, Nov. 2, at 8 p.m. Tickets are \$35.

Musical selections include Trio Opus 1 no. 1 in E flat major by Beethoven, Trio élegiaque in g minor by Rachmaninoff and Trio in c minor by Mendlessohn. The intimate setting and small audience (approximately 60 people) lends a pleasing ambience to this type of concert, reminiscent of the original concerts "a chambre" in the salons of the past.

The second concert of the series

is An Advent Celebration-Anticipating the Coming of the King, on Saturday, Nov. 30 at 8 p.m. in Knox Church, Georgetown. The choir will sing several selections well suited for the advent season accompanied by a chamber orchestra and guest soloists and conducted by Juan Castelao of Spain. The Avent Cantata by Bach, Magnificat by Vivaldi and the Christmas Concerto by Manfredini will be among the musical offerings as well as the Piano Concerto in d minor by Bach performed by the Chorale's artistic director Ronald D. Greidanus. Tickets are \$20.

The third concert, Messe de minuit pour Noel, is a fitting addition to the holiday celebrations. This performance is at 157 Main St. S. once again, on Dec. 21, with a reception following. In the home, to be decorated in seasonal garb of gold and satin ribbons, fresh evergreen boughs and twinkling lights, the Chorale will sing Charpentier's Christmas Mass, followed by Elizabethan carols and Renaissance noels. Tickets are \$35.


