Talton Region Health Department will host two information sessions to promote well water safety for people who use private well water supplies.


Residents can drop in anytime between 3 p.m. and 9 p.m. at either location.

The second session on Thursday Nov. 7, will be held at Percy Merry Public School, 263 Britannia Road at Trafalgar Road.

 Talk to public health inspectors about your well water quality concerns.



• Talk to professional well drillers from the Ont-ario Ground Water Assoc-iation.

• Talk to staff from Halton

Region's Planning and Public Works Department to discuss water conservation principles.

• Learn about water treatment systems that can correct water problems from local companies.

• You can view your well water records from the Ministry of the Environment on the Region's well record database.

• Speak with a representative from the Ontario Federation of Agriculture regarding rural well upgrades or well decommissioning subsidies.

Throughout the year, residents can drop off water samples to test for bacteria at the Health Department office in Georgetown, (93 Main St.), Monday through Thursday, between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.:


