Trio of returning Raiders holding hot scoring hand

Tuch of the talk around the Provincial Jr. A Hockey League in the off-season was about the players coming to the Georgetown Raiders. But a month into the season, it is three returning players leading the team in scoring.

Ryan Busby, Ryan McCarthy and Shane Remenda have made sure they weren't lost when the Raiders did a major off-season shuffle. The trio have combined for 36 goals in 13 games.

Remenda had his fourth two-goal effort in five games in Saturday's 4-4 tie with Burlington. McCarthy, who had the Raiders' fourth goal, came up with the game-winner in Sunday's 4-2 win over Mississauga. Meanwhile, Busby had a hat-trick in Friday's 11-4 win over Oakville.

"Honestly, I don't know what it is," Remenda said. "It's probably just coincidence. People are starting to find their roles— some are scorers, some are playmakers. Guys like Rone (Rick Varone), (Vince) Laise and (Kyle) Aitken have really been playing well."

Part of the success can be attributed to the fact the Raider veterans have managed to stay healthy. That's a claim few Raiders can make this season. Now with their stretch of eight games in 10 days behind them

Cameron Hall finds winner's circle in Breeders Crown race at Woodbine

Frkki Laakkonen's roller-coaster ride at the track continued.


A week after his stable's star, Andover Hall, escaped from the paddock at Mohawk Raceway and injured itself on a run down Hwy. 401, another of Laakkonen's horses, Cameron Hall, found the winner's circle in the Breeders Crown at Woodbine Raceway Saturday.

Cameron Hall, driven by Trevor Ritchie of Acton, won the three-year-old filly trot in 1:55.4. Cameron Hall looked to be trapped in traffic as the field rounded the final turn. But Ritchie found just enough room along the rail to squeak through and beat the others to the line.

It's been a strange season for Georgetown's Laakkonen.

Andover Hall was the favourite to win the Hambletonian but broke stride early in the race. Andover Hall came back to win the World Trotting Derby in world-record time in September.

Andover Hall would have been among the favourites in the Breeders Crown's three-year-old colt trot. But the horse escaped from the paddock and was running down the center lane of Hwy. 401 until two motorists used their
