

A terrified 3 year-old child huddles, sobbing in a dark corner of his room after being beaten by a drunken parent for spilling milk. A colicky infant cries for 8 hours, left alone, soiled and hungry, by an immature mother.

A 6 year old cries helplessly at the guilt and shame left behind. A father's touch has destroyed her family. A 7 year old boy watches his father beat his mother, the most recent of many terrorizing assaults this child has witnessed in his chaotic, violent household


