Council to decide Monday on new facility use policy

ouncil will decide Monday whether the town will implement a new policy that assigns priorities to groups using town facilities, starting in January.

Council approved the new policy at a recent meeting. Final approval will have to come at the Nov. 4 meeting.


The policy will also require all persons, groups and organizations using facilities owned or controlled by the town to carry \$2 million in liability insurance naming the town as "additional insured."

The Recreation and Parks Department schedules more than 41,000 hours annually at its various facilities for community use. The policy is aimed at ensuring all user groups are treated consistently and fairly.

Priority will be given based on a combination of the type of organization and the activity. Top priority is given to town-operated programs and activities, followed by registered minor organizations, junior sports programs (competitive), registered adult organizations, registered community organizations, previous year users (local), local residents, local district school boards, for profit/commercial and non-local residents. Activity priorities are games, community special events, practices, tournaments/events and new requests.

Among the new rules:
