

At Pre-Freeze tourney in New Jersey Midget Hawks fall in final to New York

The Halton Hills Midget Hawks went 11 nail-biting innings before being edged 5-4 by the New York Legends at the Annual Jersey Sharks Pre-Freeze Showcase Softball Tournament in Deptford, New Jersey.

Shannon Mosdell pitched her heart out in the Hawks' final game, going a strong 11 innings against the third-seeded team in the tournament. She struck out two and allowed only nine hits. Ashleigh Pechaluk and Melissa Sheppard made heads turn when they made a double play at home plate, getting the winning run out. Sarah Berry came through at

the plate and had two clutch hits for the Hawks.

The Hawks opened the tournament against the Pittsburgh Patriots. The Hawks started off well in the first inning with a lead-off triple by Lisa Mior, but struggled to get their offence going and couldn't manage to score. On the defensive side, Keri Lindsay and Kylie Kruk made an outstanding double play. Mior recorded two strikeouts and only allowed six hits, however the Hawks had trouble at the plate and lost 7-0.

Mosdell took to the mound against the South Hampton Blazers, getting four strikeouts and five hits. She also added to the

offensive side with a single. Michelle Barrett, went 3-for-3 at the plate, and Mior, Pechaluk, Berry, Katie Gannon, Lisa Simpson also had hits. On the field, Barrett and Pechaluk turned an amazing double play but the Hawks came up short in the end, losing a close 3-1.

The Hawks got their bats going against the Jersey Jaguars won 5-1. Berry had three hits, while Barrett and Mior each had two. Simpson and Kruk also added singles. Mior pitched the complete seven innings getting eight strikeouts and only allowing two hits.

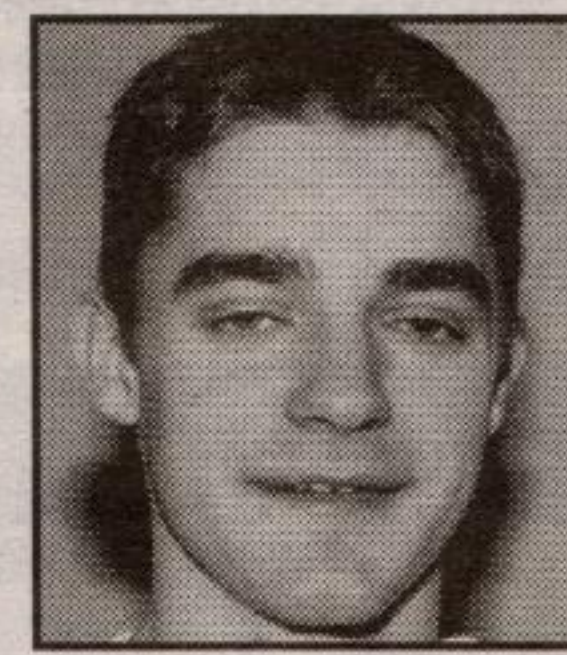

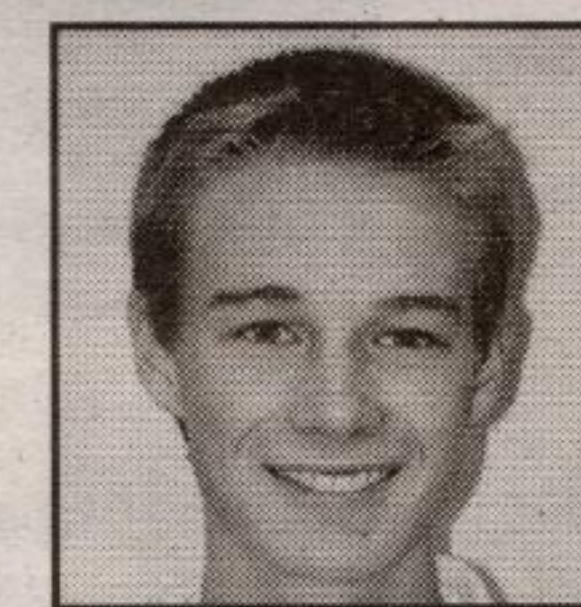

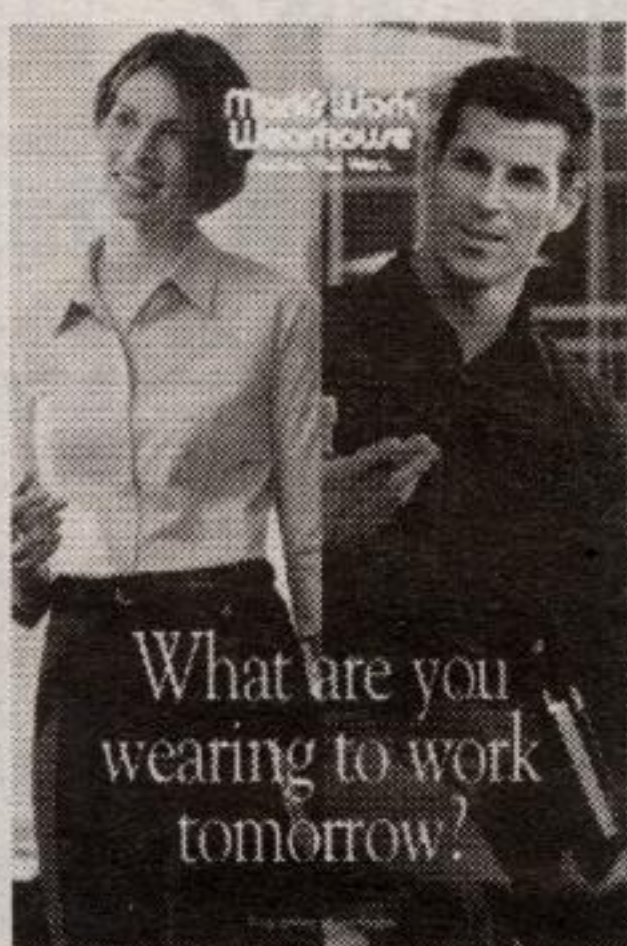
