in 1862 by Dr. James Freeman, who lived with his family and practiced medicine from this location for many years. As time went by, the house changed owners only 5 times, with the longest occupants being the "Sykes" family. The house was purchased in 1985 by Alex and Kelly Trenton, and like the original owner, they live there and also run their DENTURE CLINIC practice. So this charming old building with lots of character, whose roots began in healing, over 138 years ago, will continue as a health care facility well into the new millennium.

Sports facilities

No matter what you like to do to stay active, you will likely be able to do it in Halton Hills.

The town's three arenas are home to a variety of sports teams and groups. The Mold-Masters SportsPlex, a two-ice pad facility that includes the Alcott Arena, was originally built in 1974 and twinned in 2001. It is located at 221 Guelph Street, across from the Georgetown Market Place.

Halton Hills' first arena, Georgetown Memorial Arena, was built in 1922. It was the first artificial ice surface in Halton County (now Halton Region). It is located at 42 Mill Street.

The Acton Arena and Community Centre opened its doors in December of 1997. The arena has a main ice pad as well as a smaller leisure pad which can be used for practices or skating parties.

Outdoor rinks are operated on Churchill Rd. N. in Acton and at the Georgetown Fairgrounds during the winter months.

Georgetown and Acton each has its own curling club. The Acton club is located on Churchill Rd. N. while in Georgetown there is the North Halton Golf and Country Club on Maple Avenue.

There are two indoor pools in Halton Hills. The Georgetown Indoor Pool is located at 70 Guelph St. (at the back of Georgetown District High School) and the Acton Lions Indoor Pool at 69 Acton Blvd. (at the side of McKenzie-Smith Bennett School). Both pools are 25x12.6m.

In the summer, there are two outdoor pools. The Dick Licata Outdoor Pool is

located at 42 Mill St. (behind Memorial Arena) and the Fairy Lake Wading Pool, located in Prospect Park in Acton.


There are several tennis courts around Halton Hills open from April to mid October. Reservations can be made by calling the town at 873-2601, ext. 2269. There are four courts located beside the Mold-Masters SportsPlex, three courts in Prospect Park in Acton, two courts in Emmerson Park at the end of Carruthers Road and two courts beside George Kennedy Public School on Weber Drive. The Georgetown Racquet Club also has three courts for members as well as four squash courts.

Georgetown South Community Park has two softball diamonds, a baseball diamond, two soccer fields and a rugby/football field. There are four softball diamonds and a baseball diamond at the Georgetown Fairgrounds. In Acton, there are four softball diamonds in Prospect Park in Acton and three more behind McKenzie-Smith Bennett School. There are also two soccer fields behind the school. There are also two softball diamonds each in Glen Williams, Hornby and Limehouse.

Halton Hills has two bowling alleys, Acton Bowling Lanes (10 Main St. N) and Georgetown Bowl (12 Mountainview Rd. S), as well as the Georgetown Lawn Bowling Club on the corner of Edith and William St.

The Halton Hills Gymnastics Club, located at 36 Armstrong Ave., offers programs for children of all ages.

For skateboarders, there is a skate park located in front of the Mold-Masters SportsPlex.
