## Guilders link slain Canadian soldier to Dutch families

soldier who appreciated being welcomed by Bannink's family.

When shown a photo of Beaumont, Bannink became emotional as he vividly recalled the young Canadian and was saddened to learn he was killed only eight days after accepting the guilder.

Since the guilder was returned this year, Bannink and his wife have visited Beaumont's grave at the Holten Canadian War Cemetery.

The day after presenting Bannink with his guilder, the tour group arranged to meet Kalk, now 75, in the village of Holwierde.

While Kalk could not recall Beaumont, she did remember the fierceness of the battles in the area at the time.

She happily received the guilder with her name, a picture of Beaumont and the war diary of the Perth Regiment, which described the battles of April 28, 1945— the day Beaumont was killed.






