GEORGETOWN WATER SUPPLY MASTER PLAN REVIEW TOWN OF HALTON HILLS, GEORGETOWN, PR-1550B

Halton Region has undertaken a review of the Georgetown Water Supply Master Plan in accordance with the requirements of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process.

It has been identified that additional water supply is required to supply municipal water to the Georgetown urban area for the approved, planned growth. Several alternative servicing strategies have been identified and evaluated taking into consideration environmental and social impacts as well as financial considerations. A preferred solution was groundwater based and consisted of a combination of upgrading the existing water system and reducing the current and future water demand.

Public consultation is a key component of this Master Plan review and your comments are important. Halton Region will be holding a Public Information Centre on:

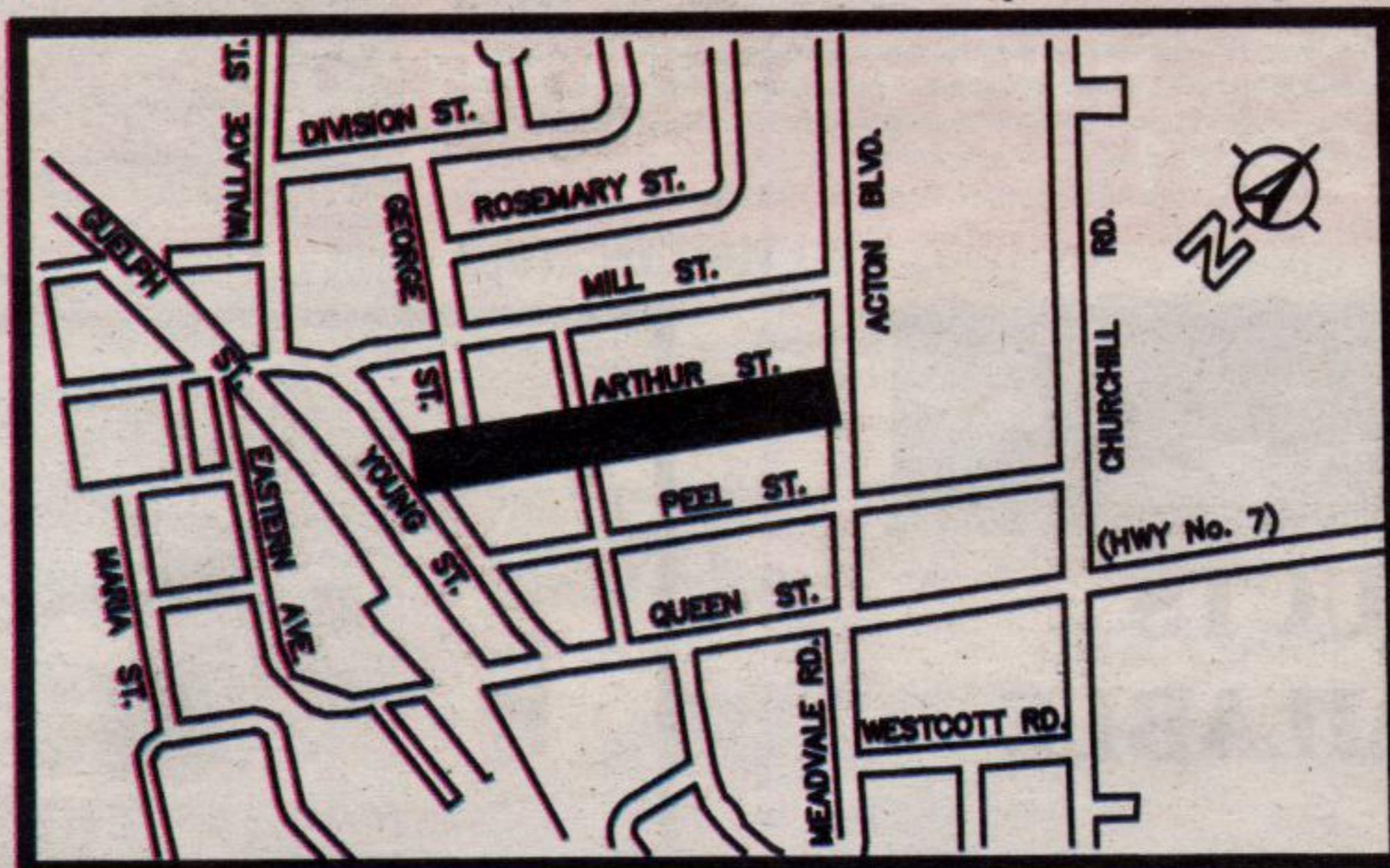


