Acton also overcame deficits of 17-12 and 23-21, finishing the game with four consecutive points to win 25-23.


"They're a good team. They know how to play. I just offered words of encouragement," Acton coach George Douzenis said of a couple timeouts that helped his team regroup.

The Rebels looked rattled as they returned to the bench but certainly not when they returned to the court.

"I just told them, 'Don't let the ref beat us,'"
Norrie said. "If you're the better team go out and show it and win this last game."

That's exactly what the Rebels did as they again stormed out to a 7-0 lead in the deciding game. This time, Acton would not be able to fight its way back, never getting closer than five points.

"We made two excellent comebacks but there just wasn't enough time for a third," Douzenis said.


