Raiders fall to Merchants, top Derbys

The Georgetown Raiders started and finished the weekend strong but the letdown in the middle cost them one important victory and very nearly a second.

Coming off a convincing 7-2 Provincial Jr. A Hockey League win over Milton, the Raiders looked to be on their way to another rout when they outshot the Merchants 26-9 in the opening period Friday night. But despite the barrage of shots, Milton remained in the game thanks to goalie Cody Spicer. The Merchants trailed 2-1 after the first and then jumped ahead with two goals early in the second.

By the opening minute of the third, the Raiders would again be in front 4-3 but a

third-period letdown let Milton score three unanswered goals.

"We went had two good periods and then we came out and things just went downhill," said Raider defenceman Dan Iliakis. Their goalie made some big stops. We had chances to score but you have to give their goalie credit, he played pretty good."

Spicer finished the game with 39 saves as the Raiders outshot Milton 43-26. The win moved Milton back into second place, a point ahead of Georgetown.

The third-period swoon carried over to Saturday as the Raiders found themselves trailing the Streetsville Derbys 3-2 in the final period.

Iliakis sparked the Raiders with his third goal of the season five minutes into the period. Less than a minute later Shane Remenda put the Raiders ahead to stay. Brent Hughes would add his second of the night and Kyle Zettler would cap a four-goal period and a 6-3 win for the Raiders.

"We started slow but we regrouped," Iliakis said. "It gives us confidence knowing we have the ability to score so that we are down by a goal or two we can come back late in the game."

After playing in Bramalea Friday, the Raiders will have an important home-and-home series with the first-place Hamilton Kilty Bees. The 20-2-1 Bees are nine points up on the Raiders in the West Conference.
