WOHC is first to hire ethicist

Tilliam Olser Health Centre has hired an ethicist, becoming the first regional hospital in Ontario to do so.

Dr. Paula Chidwick is an ethicist who has been educated and trained to assist with ethical problems that arise in health care and research settings.

In the field of medicine, ethics come to play in every interaction between patients and caregivers, caregivers and families of patients as well as between caregivers themselves.

For example, if a family insists that everything be done for their loved ones, but the medical staff believes that more treatment is futile, what should the staff do? This is where the ethicist comes into play.

"My role is not to decide what is right or wrong in a situation," said Chidwick. "I am a resource for staff, family and patients who are faced with difficult ethical issues that cause moral distress and moral residue. Moral residue occurs when your integrity is compromised because you have to do something that may be contrary to your beliefs, values and principles.

"In a case such as a family demanding treatment for their loved one, I would act as a

resource for medical staff and family helping them with the question of what should we do? Should we provide treatment or not? An ethicist would facilitate communication between the family and staff, provide conflict resolution if necessary and negotiate a resolution."

Ethicists have backgrounds in law, medicine, philosophy, theology and often, one of the various health professions, as well as special training in bioethics.

Chidwick brings to her role extensive academic and clinical training in bioethics. She received her Ph.D in Philosophy from the University of Guelph, specializing in Ethics and Bioethics and recently completed a one-year Clinic Ethics Fellowship at the University of Toronto Joint Centre for Bioethics. During the past 14 years Chidwick has provided consulta-

tion services, education, policy development and research in various health care settings. She has taught at the University of Guelph, Sir Wilfrid Laurier University and most recently, the University of Toronto.

At William Osler Health Centre, Chidwick will provide consultation services, education on ethical issues, policy development and research in bioethics. In the past much of the burden around ethical issues fell on the people directly involved in the case of the patient and the family— most often on an ad hoc basis. Now Chidwick can be called upon to address the ethical issues involved in these situations and provide the proper sup-

Chidwick's goal is to imbed ethical considerations into all aspects of decision-making at WOHC.


