Renovation complete Board next step for Museum

ith its home renovated, the Halton Hills Sports Museum is looking forward to next year's opening.

Renovations to the museum's future home in the Mold-Masters SportsPlex are complete and display cabinets are scheduled to be installed in June. Once cabinets are installed, the memorabilia will be put on display and the museum will be opened to the public.

Finn Poulstrup, chair of the collaborative currently overseeing the museum, said organizers are looking at putting together a 15member board by February. The board will then take over operation of the museum with members serving a two or three-year term.

The board will be supported by

numerous volunteer committees, each with a specific function such as fund-raising and recognition.

"We're working hard to make sure it does not just end up being museum," arena-user Poulstrup said. "We want a nonpartisan, all-sport museum. We've been trying to get the message out that it is all-inclusive."

Poulstrup said the message is getting through. The Georgetown Slo-Pitch League recently became the 15th founding member of the museum and the first not based out of an arena.






