




#### Will be third seed

### Redmen earn another trip to OFSAA with thrilling five-set win over Brampton

The Acton Redmen head into the biggest tournament of the season with plenty of experience performing under pressure.

Acton is the third seed for the Ontario Federation of Schools Athletic Association (OFSAA) A volleyball championships that begin Thursday in Toronto. It advanced to the senior boys' championship with a heart-stopping five-game victory over Brampton Christian College last week.

Acton took the first two games but Brampton rallied to square the match and force a deciding game. Brampton had done the same thing in their previous qualifier but Acton would make sure there would not be a repeat performance.

"They were fired up. They wanted it bad," said Acton coach Christopher Braun.

Acton pulled out a 15-12 victory in the fifth game to earn their spot in the provincial high school championship.

"Ever since we lost in Haltons, the guys focused really hard on OFSAA," Braun said.

It is was a lesson learned in the Halton semifinal loss to T.A. Blakelock that helped Acton reach its OFSAA goal. Acton forced the previously undefeated Blakelock to a deciding game and then came up two points shy in a 16-14 loss. Braun said the team may have leaned a little heavily on Josh Bowen, a dominating hitter who helped his club team, Bronte Beach, win a provincial juvenile title last year.

"Josh we can count on for a lot of points, but we probably passed it to him a little too much in that game. We learned from it and now we're passing the ball around more and making it a little harder for the other team. All of our guys can hit."

Among those who have stepped up to supplement the attack is Mark Boycott, who provides a consistent second offensive threat. Meanwhile, setter Matt Locke is charge of distributing the ball around the court and works well with his teammates.

"The ball is rarely put up to a spot where some-

body's not ready for it," Braun said.

Acton will play in a pool with Sudbury's Champlain, Belleville's Quinte Christian and Woodbridge's Toronto Christian. The top two teams from each of the four pools will advance to the playoff round.

Chesley is the tournament's number one seed followed by Rockway Mennonite (Kitchener) and Acton.


Georgetown opened the weekend with a 9-2 win over work Bramalea. Nik Bibic had his best Jr. A outing with a goal and four assists.
