## Police seeking three men after five assaulted in Queen St. home invasion

Halton Police are searching for three men after a home invasion at a Georgetown apartment Tuesday night.

Police report at 9 p.m. three men wearing gloves and masks forced their way into a Queen St. apartment where five people were visiting at the time.

One of the men was carrying a baseball bat, and a demand for money was made. When no money

was handed over, the five people were punched, kicked and one person was hit on the back with a baseball bat. No one was seriously injured.

The suspects then ransacked the apartment stealing a Sony Playstation video game system and a metal cash box, which contained a chequebook and a small amount of cash.

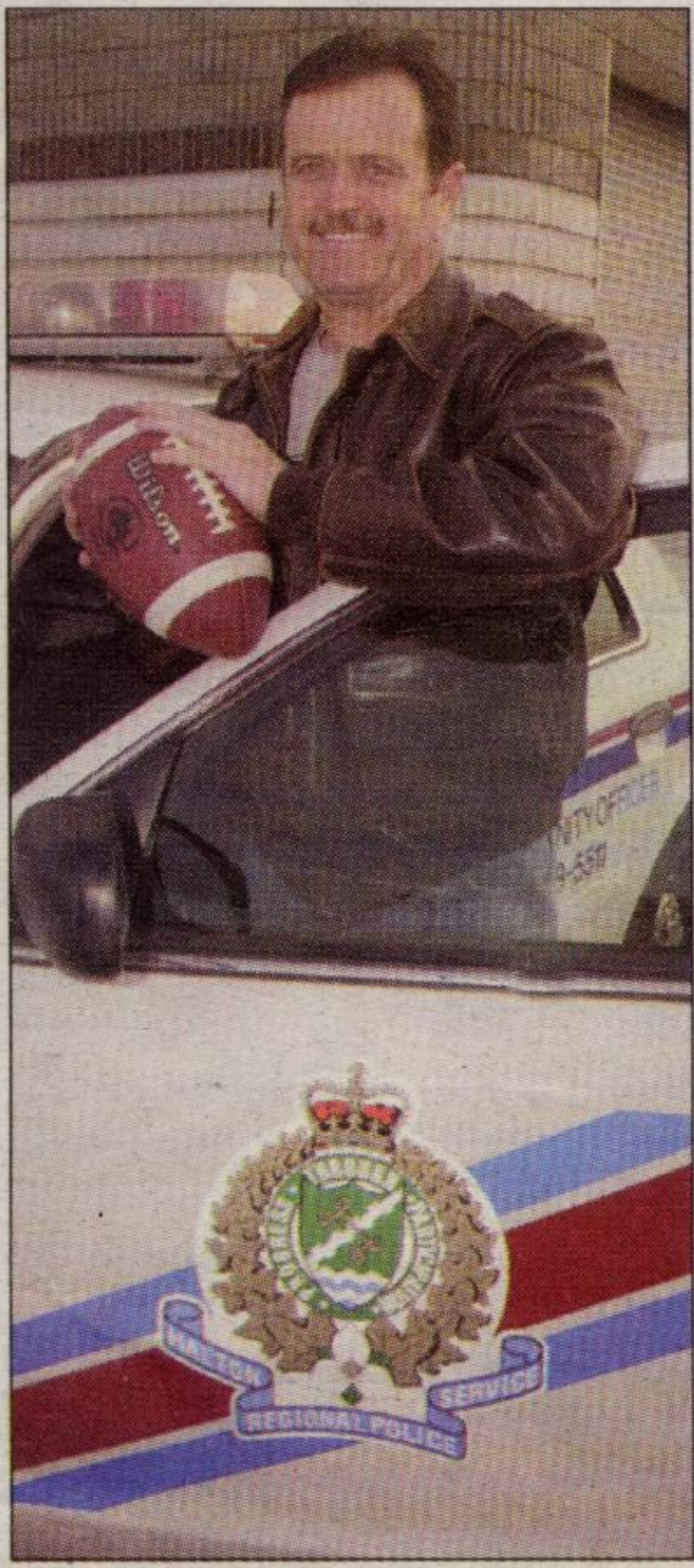
The cash box was later recovered near the scene.

One of the victims then called police when the suspects fled via the fire escape stairs. There was no suspect vehicle seen.

The men are described as black, 17 to 22 years old. One was 6', with a medium build, and wearing a red sweatshirt, red balaclava, red ski gloves and black running shoes with white laces. There were no further descriptions on the other two men.
