
. Lend Me Your Ears

Town hopes agreement with Hydro eliminates 'butchering' of trees

The Town of Halton Hills is hoping an agreement with Halton Hills Hydro (HHH) will prevent the future "butchering" of town trees.

The agreement springs from discontent about tree trimming done around hydro lines by a HHH contractor last year. Chief Administrator Officer (CAO) Steve Andrews ordered a stop to the trimming until an agreement was worked out.


The agreement calls on the town's public works supervisor to approve trimming of trees on road allowances around hydro wires. Town engineer Bob Austin said a guide has been produced by the Electrical Utilities and Safety Association that forms the basis for the cut, but each tree will be individually inspected and agreed upon before cuts are made.

"The idea is to stop the butchering and this agreement is a way to make this happen," Austin said.

"Thank you to staff for flagging this issue for us," said Councillor Jane Fogal. "When I look at the trees on Hyland Ave. (Georgetown), I was told many had survived but I couldn't imagine that when I saw them. ... I wonder if the decision had been made to replace them on Hyland?"

HHH has agreed to provide 19 new trees for the damaged trees. Austin said the location of tree replacement is still being negotiated but Hyland Ave. is high on his list.


