Youth concert at the Acton Legion Saturday

Hepatitis C is focus of youth-run education program

Plose to 1,000 youths in Halton are potentially at risk for Hepatitis C and to combat the problem, a one-year educational program for youths aged 15-24, has been set up to educate them about the disease.

"Young people engage in risky activity between these ages," said Kimm Kent, North Halton Youth Hepatitis C Prevention Project Coordinator. "We want youths to be safe, and to know the risks."

"About 240,000 Canadians have Hepatitis C and about 70 per cent don't know they have it," said Kent. About 5,000 Canadians will get this disease each year she added.

Hepatitis C has no cure and is a liver disease that can cause cirrhosis, liver cancer and failure and is spread only through blood to blood contact, she explained. That contact can come from tattoos and piercing with unsterile equipment, sharing razors or toothbrushes with infected persons or injection drug use (sharing needles and equipment).

According to the 1999 Drug Survey, 916 youth used injection drugs in North Halton sometime during that year; 168 used heroin; 479 used speed;

269 used cocaine.

The north Halton program recruited nine young people "from highfunctioning youths to at-risk youths to be trained as Hepatitis C prevention peer educators." Their mission: to get

the message out about Hepatitis C prevention.

The team focused on reaching experimental, adventureare more at risk as a result of alternative lifestyles, subculture (body art

such as tattoos, piercing), hard drug or intravenous drug use, steroid use or homelessness. They put together three projects called Hep What.

The first was a skit presented to high school students in Acton, Georgetown and Milton. The skit talks about how to prevent Hepatitis C and if choosing to abuse drugs, not to share straws for sniffing coke, needles, razors and to use condoms.


The second was a poster contest, sponsored by The Altered Native, Up

Your Bike, Boardtopia, Tim Hortons (Acton), Mountainview Residence, Acton IGA and Glenoven Bakery. Georgetown High School student Emina Cejvanovic won the contest with a poster (inset) of a woman doctor, with the words Be Aware, 70 per cent of infected Canadians don't know they have Hepatitis C, do you? Second place went to Kristen Bailey and third to Vicky Pickinton.

The third project is a Hep What concert to be held on Saturday, May 10, at the Acton Legion. The concert starts at 9 some youth who p.m. and ends at 1 a.m. Buses will be picking up youths from the Georgetown skate park at 8 p.m. and dropping them off by 1:45 a.m. A bus also leaves from the E.C. Drury High School parking lot in Milton at 8 p.m. Local bands on the bill include Fork, New State of Mind, Love Letter Refugee, Dawn Broke Early, Mimi and Better Then Nothing. The concert is free.






