

Local swimmers spark Marlins at team meet

Kim Galvin of Acton won four gold medals to help the Milton Marlins capture the Ontario Division II team championship in Thunder Bay.

Galvin took first in the 200m and 400m freestyle and, along with Jessica Switzer of Georgetown, was a member of the gold-medal winning 13-14 year-old girls 200m freestyle and 200m medley relay teams.

Galvin also won bronze medals in the 100m freestyle and 200m individual medley and placed fifth in the 50m freestyle.

Switzer also had an impressive medal collection. She took silver in

both the 50m freestyle and the 100m breaststroke and added bronze medals in the 200m breaststroke and 200m butterfly. Switzer made two other finals, placing sixth in the 100m butterfly and eighth in the 100m freestyle.

Four other Halton Hills swimmers also contributed to the Marlins victory. Evan Ries narrowly missed earning a medal with fourth-place finishes in the 10-and-under boys 50m butterfly and 200m freestyle. Ries was fifth in the 50m backstroke, sixth in the 100m butterfly and seventh in the 100m freestyle.

Alex Ries finished fifth in the 10-and-under boys 50m backstroke while Gillian Arseneau was seventh in the

11-12 girls 800m freestyle and 400m individual medley. James Bramley turned in an eighth-place result in the 13-14 boys 200m backstroke.

In total, the Marlins won 88 medals— 48 of them gold. Next year the Marlins will compete in the Division I Team Championships.

It was the second straight championship for the Marlins, who won the Division III title last season.

"We certainly didn't expect this. I don't think a team winning Division III one year has ever gone on to win Division II the next. The kids swam their hearts out," said assistant coach Doug Galvin.

Squirt Hawks perfect
