

St. Jacques wins four events at Gymfest Invitational meet

Andrew St. Jacques of the host Halton Hills Gymnastics Club won four individual events on the way to victory in the Interclub 13-and-over division at Gymfest Invitational Gymnastics Competition held at the Halton Hills club.

St. Jacques scored a 9.85 to win the floor exercise and took first on the rings with a 9.90. He also won the vault (9.70) and parallel bars (9.80). He placed third on high bar and fifth on pommel horse to finish with an all-around score of 57.85.

Corey Gillies shared first in the vault with a score of 9.70 and placed second on both parallel bars, floor and rings. That earned him a second-place finish in the all-around in the Interclub 7-8 division.

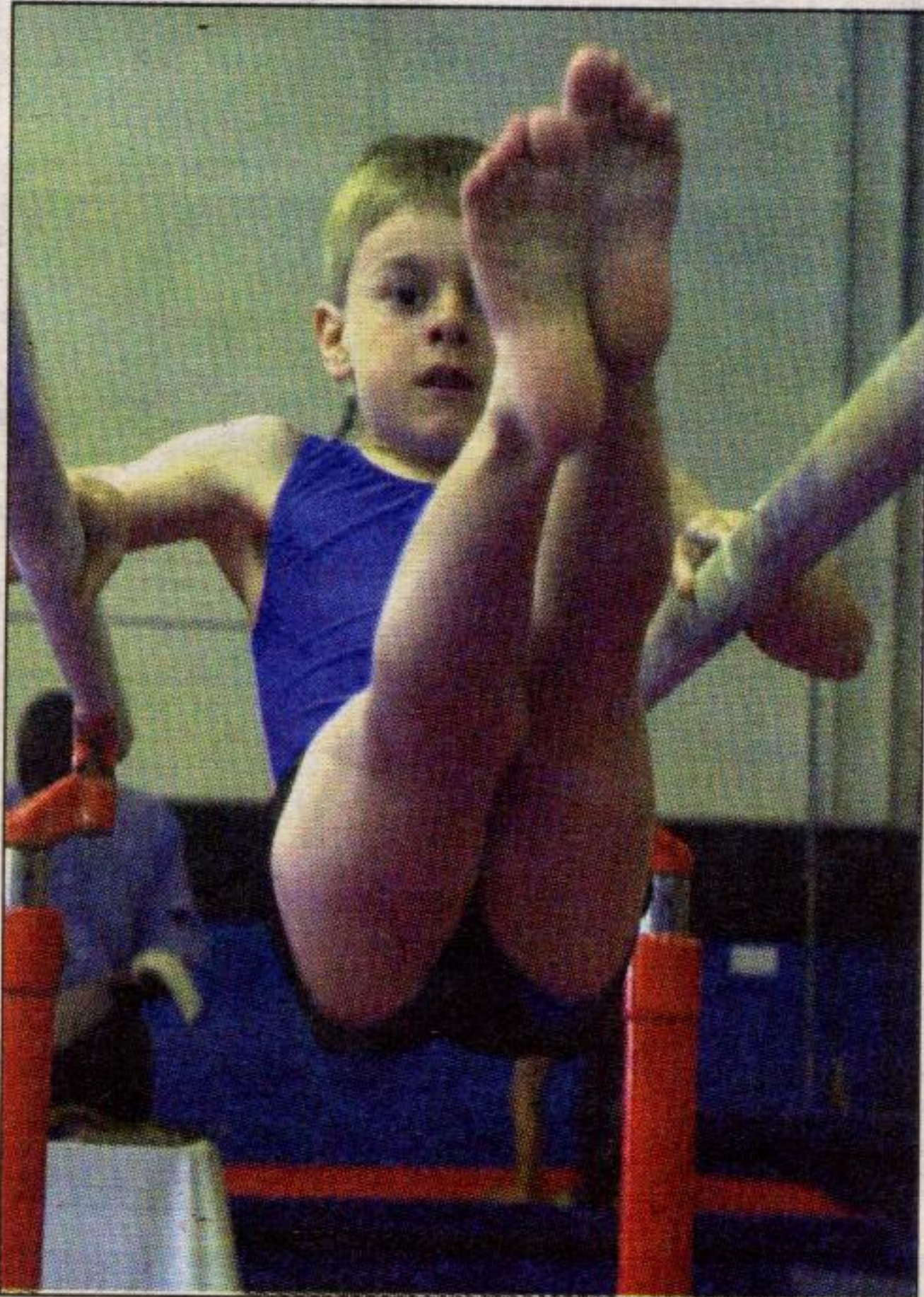

Kogon clan cleans up at Racquet Club open

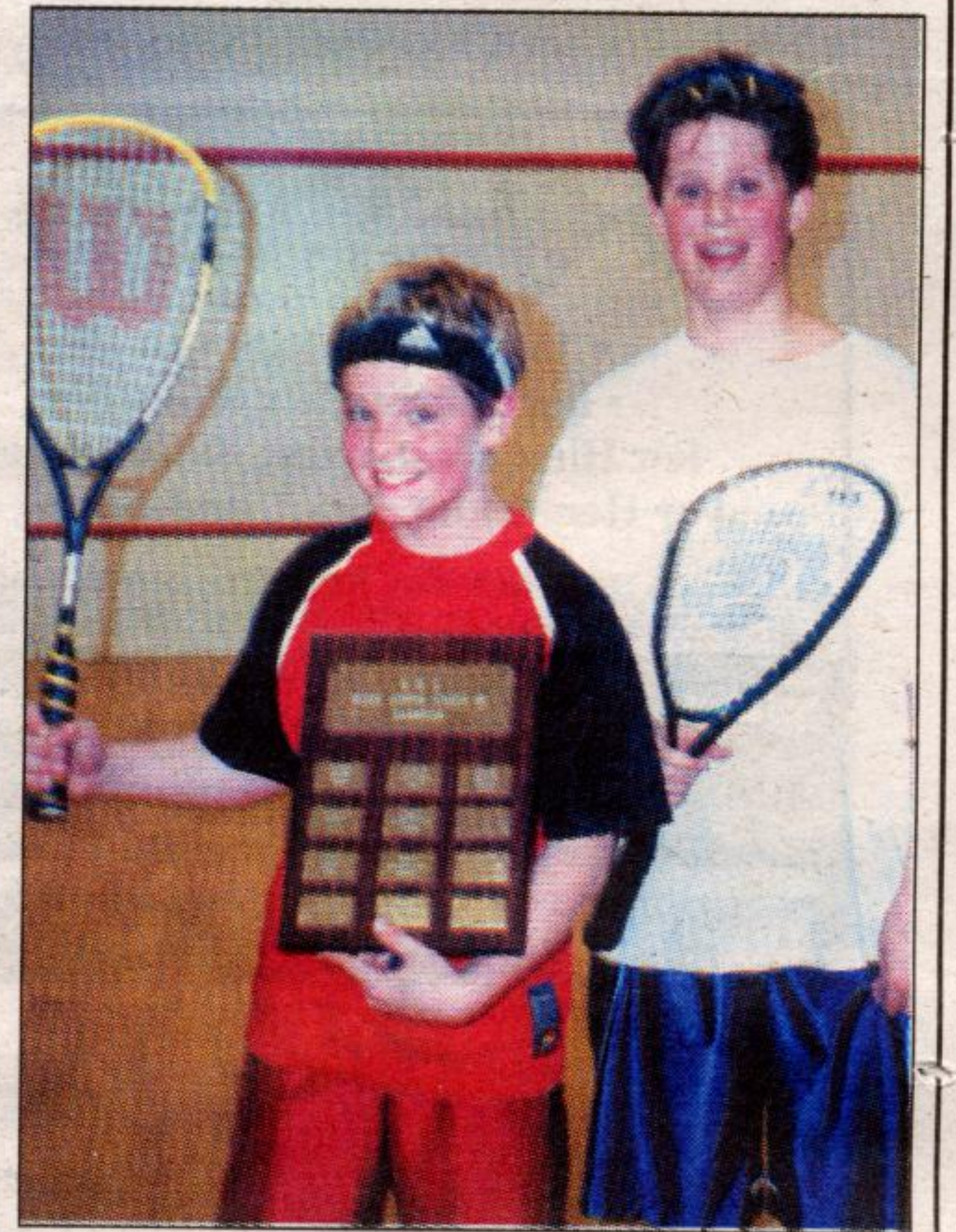
The Kogon family claimed three titles and almost a fourth at the Georgetown Racquet Club open championship.

The Abbies were edged 1-0 in over-

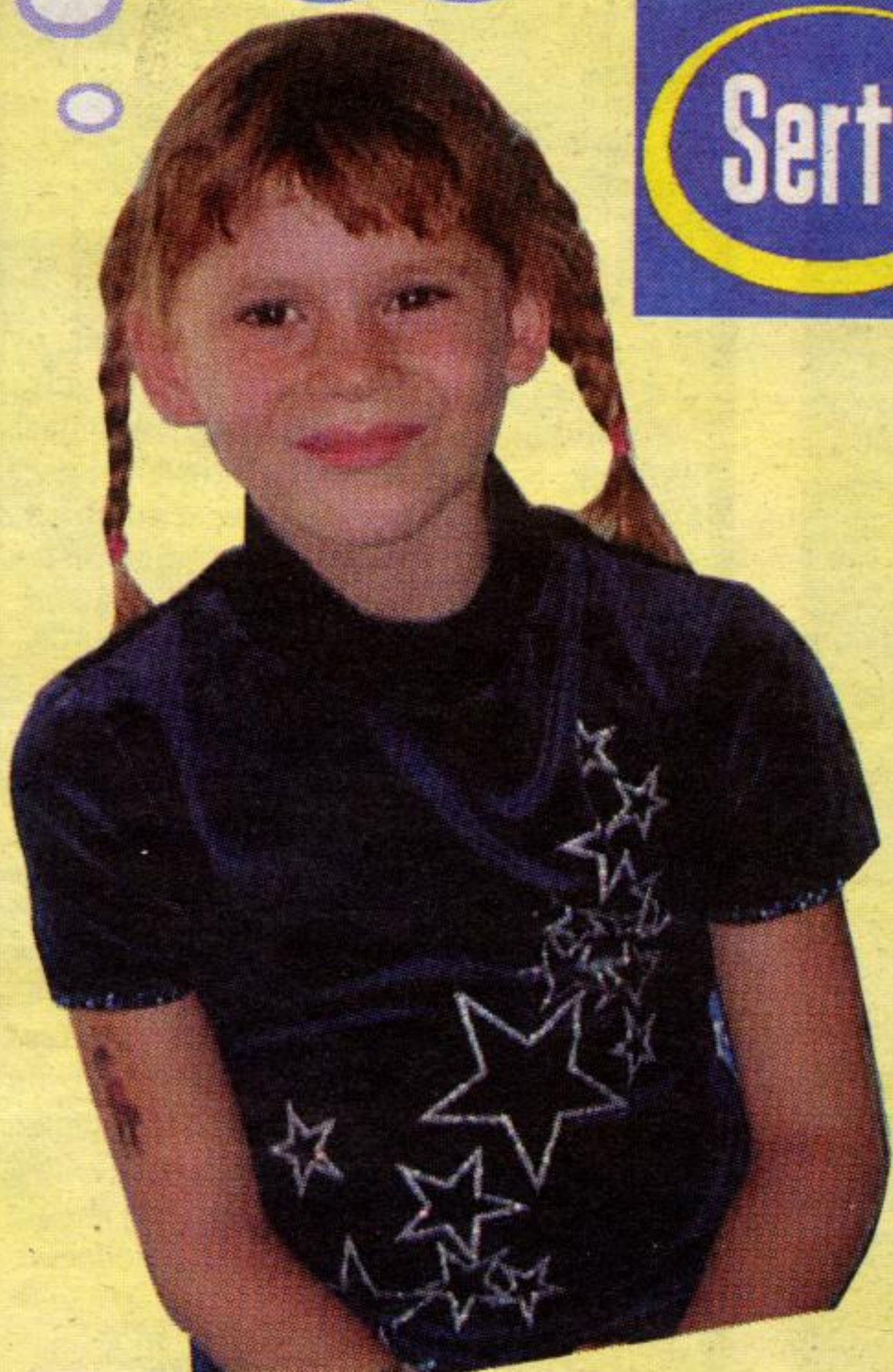
time by Wellington earlier. They also lost to Lennoxville in double overtime in their tournament opener.
