It self-levels to a smooth finish in just a few minutes and stays crystal clear. It may be applied over almost any surface, rough or smooth. Leather, wood, varnish, ceramics, rocks, dried flowers, shells are just some of the items you can cover. It cures to a thick, high gloss coat in about 24 hours. One coat is usually all that is needed to produce the desired finish.

Design ideas and directions:

Magazine and newspaper clippings or photos - After the item has been mounted to the surface, seal the entire plaque with a solution of four parts white glue and one part water. This will prevent the item from becoming translucent. Wait three to four hours before applying Circa 1850 Nu-Lustre-55.

Craft items- Circa 1850 Nu-Lustre-55 can make any craft project come to life. You can protect your favorite puzzle with its high-gloss crystal clear finish.
