Proposed Official Plan Amendment (POPA 03-03) to the
Town of Caledon Official Plan (OPA 179) regarding
the Agricultural and Rural Area Policies

The Town of Caledon is in the process of conducting a review of its Agricultural and Rural Area policies. An official plan amendment has been prepared which reflects the results of this review. Highlights of the proposed official plan amendment include the following:

- Designation of a Prime Agricultural Area, General Agricultural Area and Rural Area and the identification of permitted uses for each of these designations.
- Expansion of economic opportunities for farmers through such activities as secondary uses and agri-tourism.
- Limitations on consents for severances so as to protect agricultural uses and agricultural land.
- Expansion of opportunities for rural-tourism uses particularly in the Rural Area designation.
- Identification of the Coulterville Special Study Area for low intensity, environmentally-based tourism opportunities and limited resort development.

A key map is not provided because the proposed official plan amendment applies throughout the Town of Caledon.

This Public Meeting is intended to satisfy the public consultation requirements established by the *Planning Act*. After the Public Meeting, the proposed official plan amendment will be brought to a subsequent meeting of the Town Council for adoption. If a person or public body that files a notice of appeal of a decision of the Town of Caledon in respect of the proposed official plan amendment does not make oral submissions at a public meeting, or make written submissions to the Town before the proposed official plan amendment is adopted, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal.

The above-noted proposed official plan amendment will be available for public review a minimum of twenty (20) days prior to the Public Meeting. A copy of the proposed official plan amendment can be obtained by visiting the Town Planning & Development Department, or by calling (905) 584-2272, Ext. 2111, or toll free 1-800-303-2546, or is available on the Town of Caledon Website at www.town.caledon.on.ca. Office hours are Monday to Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Written submissions may be mailed or personally delivered to the Planning and Development Department at the above noted address.

Fogal, Falls to run in Nov. election

The list of candidates for the November municipal election continues to grow with the addition of two more names last week.

Current Ward 3 Councillor Jane Fogal filed her nomination papers Friday for Wards 3/4 regional councillor, the position currently held by John Day who has filed for the mayor's job.

Georgetown resident Dawn Falls also entered the election race Friday, filing for one of the Ward 3 council spots currently held by Fogal and Moya Johnson.

Fogal said with both Rick Bonnette and John Day vying for the mayor's position "no matter what happens the town is losing two experienced members of regional council."

Fogal said the town needs regional representatives who are familiar with regional issues.

"I think I can provide a strong voice for

Halton Hills," said Fogal, who has been a local councillor for six years. "There are issues at the region right now that are going to affect us greatly."

Falls, a Georgetown resident for 18 years, said she decided to run "because I believe in the people of Georgetown and I care about the people in Georgetown."

"I figured my heart's always been here, why not my actions?"

Falls has no previous council experience, but has been involved with the Georgetown Farmers' Market since its inception (as co-chair for four years), and the town's Communities in Bloom project for three years. She works at Foodstuffs in Georgetown.

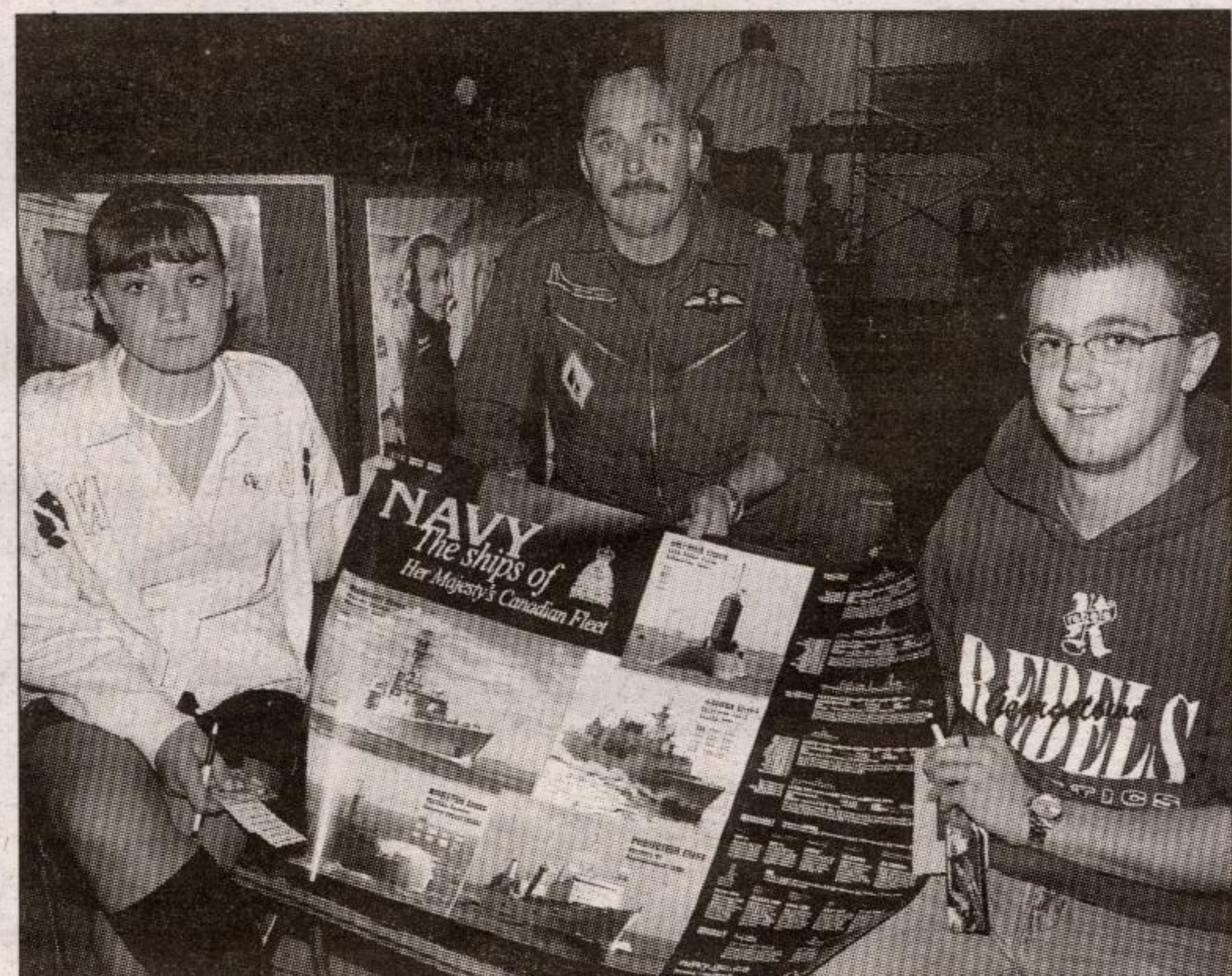
Both Fogal and Falls are running for positions outside of the wards they live in. Fogal lives in Ward 2 and Falls in Ward 4.
