





New Mount Pleasant GO Rail Station Facility City of Brampton

THE STUDY

GO Transit, the Province of Ontario's interregional public transit service for the Greater Toronto and Hamilton areas, is undertaking a Preliminary Design and Environmental Assessment for a new rail station facility located on the Georgetown Rail Corridor, between the Brampton and Georgetown GO Stations, at the intersection of Creditview Road and Bovaird Drive (Highway 7), in the City of Brampton. The new Mount Pleasant GO Station will increase access to the Georgetown Rail Corridor, enhance GO service to commuters in the Brampton and Georgetown areas, and allow for increased service as the region further develops. The facility will include a bus loop, kiss and ride area and parking for approximately 600 vehicles. The Study is in the Preliminary Design Stage, which involves the development of the preferred layout for the site.

The project will follow the planning process for a "Group B" project as contained in the GO Transit - Class Environmental Assessment (1995) with the opportunity for ongoing public involvement.

GO Transit staff and the study consultant will be on hand to discuss plans, answer questions and receive comments.
