
Town buys aquacide machine to kill weeds

The town will buy an hot water weed spraying equipment from G.C. Duke Equipment Ltd. of Burlington for \$18,315. G.C. Duke is the only known supplier of this equipment, which uses super-heated water to eliminate weeds. The hot water essentially scalds the plant and kills it; there is no need for posticide use. The machine will

be used in public areas such as rural road allowances, interlocking stone walkways in the downtown or under bleachers in parks.

Town council had approved the spending of \$35,000 in the 2003 capital budget for the equipment; the remainder of the cash will be used to buy a trailer to tow the

Catholic High School in September, Owens has already been actively involved with the new school community as a member of Connections Conference Steering Committee, the junior boys soccer team, and as the school's representative on the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council.

Before the high school opened Owens, who previously attended St. Francis of Assisi, served on Christ the King's Student Liaison Team, helping to select the school's uniform, school colours and team name.

The two other student trustees appointed to the board are Claire Schiller (Burlington student trustee) of Assumption Secondary School and Michael Yip (Oakville student trustee) of St. Ignatius Loyola Secondary School.

They were welcomed to the board table last Tuesday and replace Kristyna Opletal (north Halton), Jessie Hession (Burlington), and Martina Kumovic (Oakville).


Student trustees have the same rights as trustees to participate in board meetings, however they can't attend in camera sessions and they don't have voting rights.
