Police blotter

Several windows smashed by vandals

Halton Police report several property damage incidents over the past few days including:

- A rear window in a Suzuki parked at a Grey Gate home late Saturday was smashed with a fire hydrant cap. Damage is estimated at \$1,000

- A window, valued at \$500, was broken at Georgetown Market Place late Saturday or early Sunday

- A window, valued at \$75, was smashed at Harrison Public School late Sunday or early Monday

- A John St. resident was awakened by the sound of a large window being broken early Friday. Damage is estimated at \$500.

- A window at the rear of Christ the King Catholic Secondary School was smashed with a fire hydrant cap Sunday afternoon. Damage is \$800.

- A shopping cart was pushed through a window at Bayne's Physiotherapy on Sinclair Ave. some time Sunday. Damage is estimated at \$400.

Police are investigating the theft late Saturday or early Sunday of a Stihl gas auger valued at \$8,000 from an unlocked store room at Silvercreek Public School while it was under construction.

Two Bombardier Sea-Doos and a white Kara trailer, valued at \$5,000 in total, were taken from the driveway of a Treanor Cr. home some time Wednesday.

Halton Police report a portable toilet was destroyed by fire at Belmont Blvd. and Stonebrook Cr. early Monday. Damage is estimated at \$1,000.

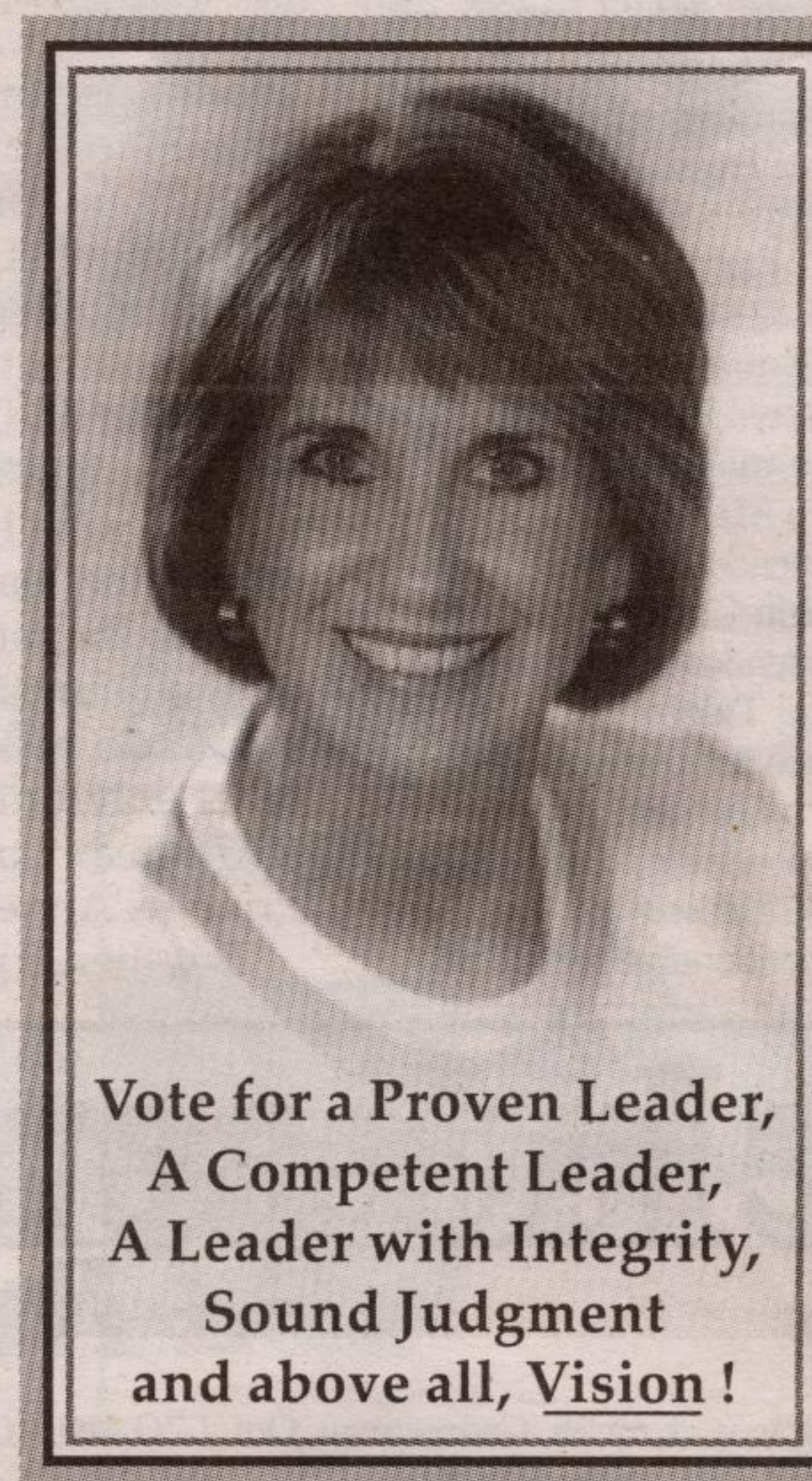
Roads and Transportation Corridors
