


#### Double thrills

#### BOTTLE DRIVE Support the Novice AAA Hurricanes





### MINOR MOSQUITO EAGLES SEASON END UPDATE

The Georgetown Baseball Minor Mosquito Eagles (sponsored by Swiss Chalet and Hunter International) had a tremendous year of baseball. The coaching staff of Scott Grandin, Glenn Cunningham and Brian Muirhead were very proud of the team's accomplishments for the season play, the tournaments and the playoffs.

During season play, the team came in third overall with a season record of 14 wins, 8 losses and 1 tie. They entered into four tournaments: St.Catherines, Ajax, Bolton and London. The St.Catherines Tournament was the first and they missed out qualifying for the playoffs by a 3 run differential. Their next tournament was Ajax, their biggest challenge, as it was open to "AAA", "AA" and A" teams. Out of the 3 qualifying games they netted 1 win, and the two losses were very close against "AAA" squads. In the Bolton tournament, The Eagles made the playoffs and they lost the semi-final game to Newmarket, (a "AAA" ranked team), the tournament favorites, by only 2 runs. The Minor Mosquito's final tournament was in London. Though they had a shaky Friday night game, they came through with two wins on the Saturday (both mercies) but again lost out on run differentials for the qualification into the playoffs...an excellent effort by a developing Baseball team.

The team started to become a threat within their tier and during the Regional Playoffs (COBA, Central Ontario Baseball Association) they made it to the finals only to be defeated by Mississauga by a score of 6-3. The game was tied up until the 6th inning. The 2003 Georgetown Minor Mosquito team roster was as follows: 1/ Matt (Pants) Aversa, # 20, the teams' Pitching Practitioner, capable of slicing strike out after strike out on opposing batters, 2/ Matthew (No Name) Berlingieri, # 14, one of the outfield specialists, had the ability to run down fly balls and slap out hits in clutch situations, 3/ Jordon Blum, # 9, the 3rd baseman, had the ability to snag down a ball hit down the line and fire a runner out at first, 4/ Warren (Bronco) Brayne, # 3, one of the outfield specialists, came on strong when needed the most in the Playoffs and the OBA's with key hits at much needed times, 5/ Kyle (G-Dog) Burns, # 25, Team Captain, pitcher, catcher, and infielder...the teams multi-position player with an ability to get on base as the teams lead off hitter, 6/ Alex (Baldy Jr.) Cunningham, # 7, short stop extraordinaire, capable of knocking down any ball hit anywhere on the left side, one of the teams pitchers and the teams clean up power hitter, 7/ Matthew (Matrix) Grandin, # 6, the leagues "Bunting King", as fast as the wind, and the team could always rely on him to drop the ball down the line, 8/ Corey (Haymaker) Hayward, # 11, infield and outfield specialist, an overall utility player capable of playing any position, and hitting or bunting in any situation, 9/ Ryan (Bomber) Hunter, # 33, the teams 1st baseman and catcher, always a threat at bat and the teams most improved player, 10/ Hayden (Hammer) Mancini, # 18, a threat at bat and on the bases, team catcher and one of the team's Pitchers; runners didn't even try to steal on Hammer for if they did, count on an out, 11/ Matthew (M&M) Muirhead, #8, 2nd baseman, outfield specialist and Pitcher, the team could utilize M&M anywhere at anytime and could power hit, clutch hit and bunt at will, 12/ Corey (Corkey) Warden, # 13, outfield specialist, a glove the size of the fishing net, Corey could always hunt down a fly hit anywhere near him.
