Winston Churchill Boulevard between Embleton Road/5 Sideroad and Mayfield Road/River Drive Class Environmental Assessment

### **Proponents**

The Regional Municipality of Peel, in association with the Region of Halton and the Town of Halton Hills, is undertaking a Class Environmental Assessment Study to examine options for the rehabilitation of Winston Churchill Boulevard between Embleton Road/5 Sideroad and Mayfield Road/River Drive.

Winston Churchill Boulevard is a boundary road separating the Region of Halton and the Region of Peel. Jurisdiction over the roadway is shared between the Regions of Halton and Peel.

#### Background

The municipalities are responsible for the management and rehabilitation of Winston Churchill Boulevard. A number of factors have influenced the need for this corridor study. These include:

- capacity deficiencies (existing and future);
- structural condition:
- identified safety issues; and
- approved and proposed changes in land uses.

#### Approach

The Winston Churchill Boulevard corridor study will be undertaken in accordance with the Municipal Engineers' Association "Municipal Class Environmental Assessment", June 2000 (Class EA) and falls within the scope of projects described in Schedule "C" of the Class EA document.

### **Public Consultation**

Public Consultation is vital to this study. We want to ensure that anyone with an interest in this study has the opportunity to get involved and provide input. This study will include a comprehensive public consultation program including at least two public information centres (PICs) (first likely in early 2004). Details regarding the forthcoming PICs will be advertised as the study progresses.

We are interested in any comments that you may have about the study. All comments will become part of the public record.


# Attention Halton Gardeners! Fall Compost Give-Away
