# Halton tire amnesty continues

Area residents can now discard up to eight passenger vehicle tires until September 30 free of charge at the Halton Waste Management Site on Hwy. 25.

Old tires can collect rainwater, providing a breeding ground for mosquitoes and Halton Region provides the tire recycling service to divert tires from disposal and as its contribution to the fight against West Nile Virus.

Residents can drop off the tires at the Waste Management Site between 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday to Saturday.

· Commercial vehicle, truck and tractor tires cannot be accepted.

• Tires are not accepted as part of Halton Region's regular or bulk waste collection.


· All tires collected will be sent to a recycling company that finds secondary uses for tires.


# Timbits Soccer. Where smiles are as wide as goalposts.
