Intruder enters baby's room

olice are looking for a man after two incidents in town, including one on Windsor Rd. in which a woman saw a man leaving her three-month-old daughter's bedroom Sunday evening.

At about 11:50 p.m. police report a woman heard a noise coming from her daughter's room. She went to investigate and saw a man leaving the room. She yelled at the man who fled from the house. Nothing was taken.

Police were called and searched the area with the canine unit but did not find the man who is believed to have left in an unknown vehicle.

The man is described as white, possibly of European descent, 40 to 50 years old, 5'9", clean shaven, with short dark hair, average build and a slim face. He was wearing a red patterned shirt that was unbuttoned at the time, dark casual pants, and dark shoes.

Police believe the man entered the home through an unlocked front door and think he may be the same man involved in another incident in town at a Hepburn Cr. home Thursday morning.

At 8:20 a.m. police report a man attempted to open the locked front door of the home and was also seen peeking through the front door window, then sat down on the front step and smoked a cigarette. The homeowner confronted the man, who fled, and was last seen walking northbound on Hepburn Cr. •

The man in that incident has a similar description. He is 40 to 50 years old, tall, slim, unshaven, with grey facial hair, and a skinny face. He was carrying a cross-shoulder grey bag with a yellow stripe on it.
