

What is ADHD?

Parent Education Network and the ADHD Committee are presenting a seminar to assist parents of children with Attention Deficit Hyperactive Disorder, or Attention Deficit Disorder on Thursday, Oct. 16.

Dr Jill Pickett Ph.D., clinical psychologist, will speak at the John Elliott Theatre (Halton Hills Cultural Centre), 9 Church St., Georgetown. She will direct her comments to parents of 5 to 12 year olds, but anyone is welcome.

The tickets are \$5 and are available at The Freckled Lion Bookstore on Main St., Georgetown, and the Ontario Early Years Centres in Milton and Georgetown.

There will be a series of workshops in the weeks following the seminar. The Georgetown workshops will be held at the Ontario Early Years Centre at 96 Guelph St. on Tuesday evenings from October 28 to November 25. The Milton series will be held at the Ontario Early Years Centre at 917 Nipissing Road on Monday evenings from October 27 to November 24. All workshops are from 7 to 9 p.m.

The topics covered are Working with the School System, Family and Sibling Issues, Social Skills and Behaviour Management, Understanding Medication, and Self Help.


