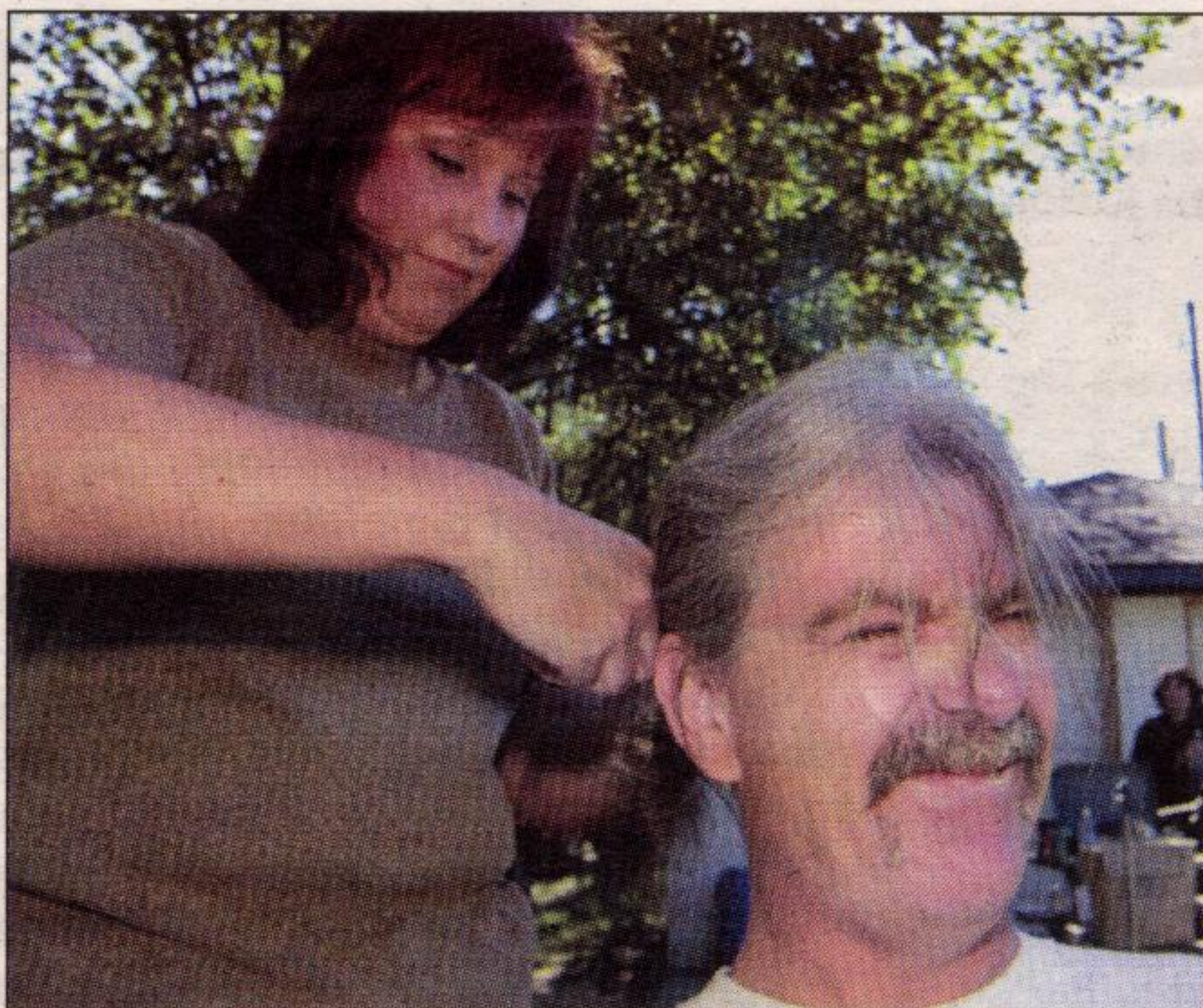

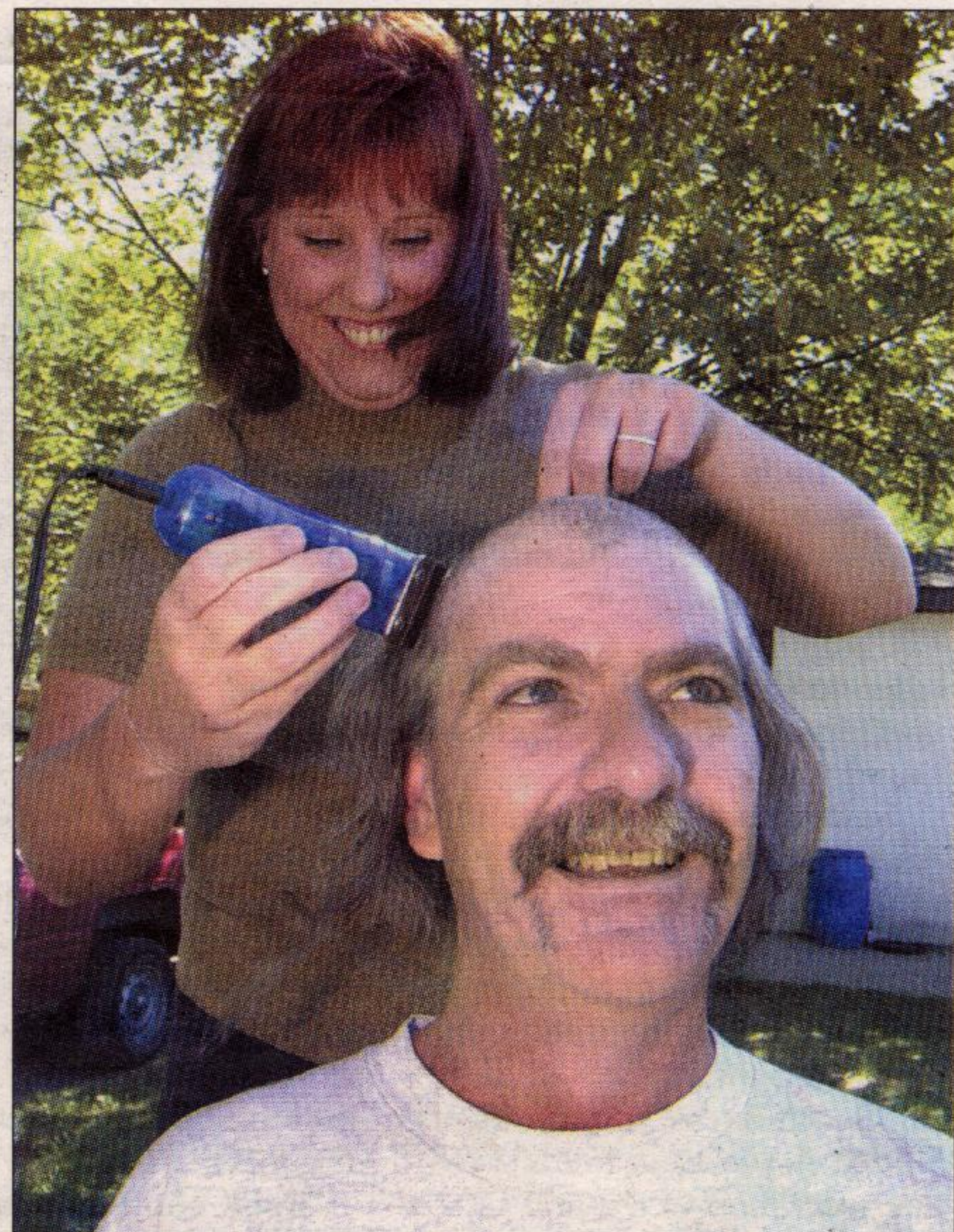

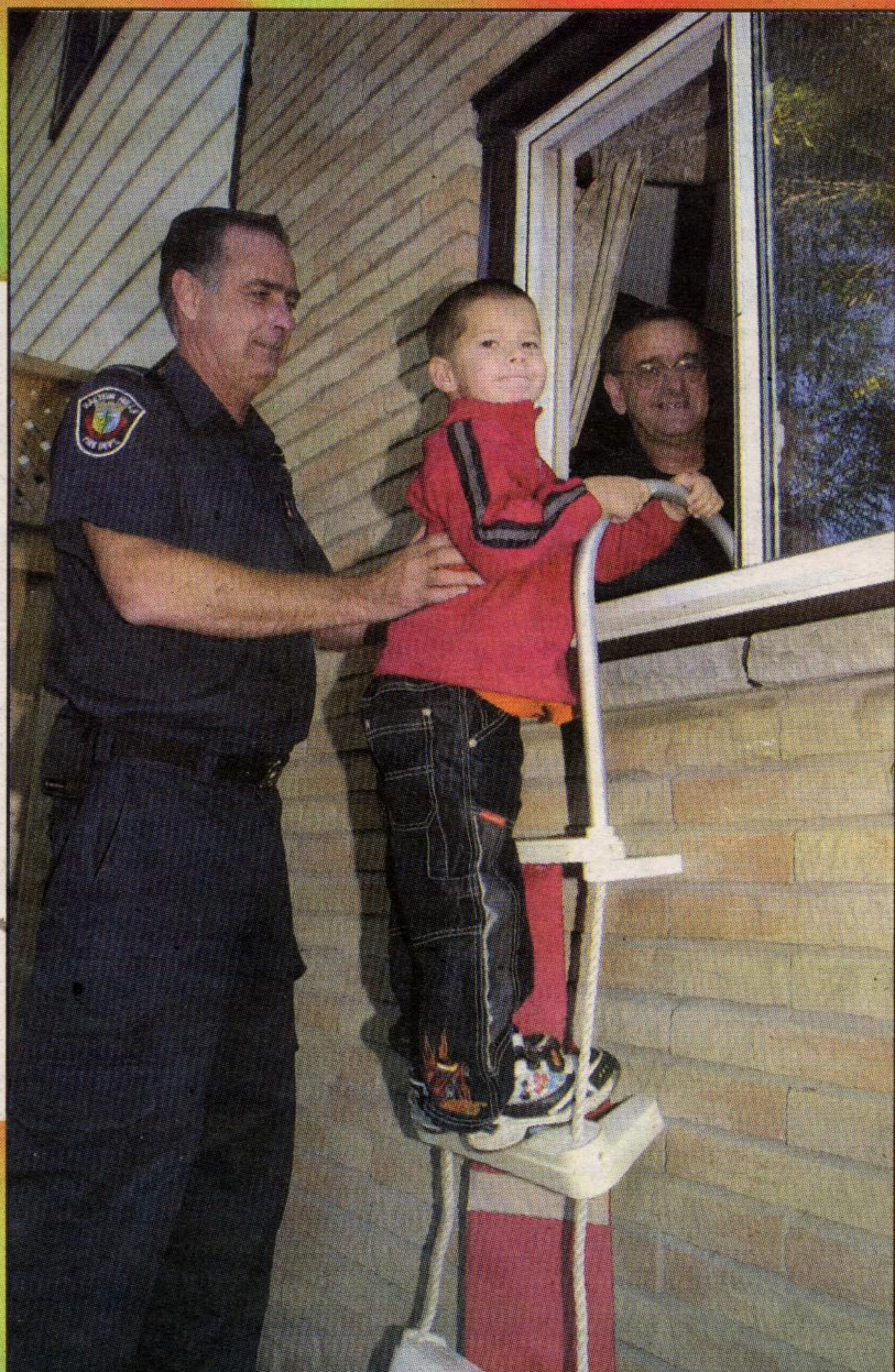

Fire Prevention Week **OCTOBER 5 - 11, 2003**
**"WHEN FIRE STRIKES:
GET OUT! STAY OUT!"**

The theme of this year's campaign, "When Fire Strikes: Get Out! Stay Out!", is intended to teach two very simple but life-saving lessons: install smoke alarms and test them regularly; and develop and practice home escape drills.

Fire Safety Specialist Doug Andrews says "most fatal fires occur where people feel safest - in their homes, usually during the night when everyone is sleeping". Fire Safety Specialist David Ford adds that "85% of all fires occur in the home, and most of these fires are preventable". Ford also added "in a fire, every second can mean the difference between life and death. Install smoke alarms, change the batteries twice a year and test them monthly".

If fire strikes, get out right away and call the Fire Department from a neighbour's telephone. Never go back inside to retrieve possessions. Get out and stay out!

Look for our Fire Prevention Information Booth and Representative at the Georgetown Market Place during the week. Staff will be on hand with Fire Prevention literature and answering any questions you may have.

Junior Kindergarten through to grade 2 students in participating Risk Watch Schools will have personal visits by Fire Prevention Staff and participate in a new and exciting program for 2003. Utilizing the Departments' ReHab Trailer, students will get a first hand look at the introduction of a "theatre" smoke entering a room, hearing the smoke alarm activate, then crawling with the firefighter to a safe exit.

This exercise is to strengthen and enhance the two simple but life-saving lessons to install smoke alarms, develop and practice home escape drills.
