

Buchanan motors to third-place finish in Newfoundland rally

Tud Buchanan left his mark on Newfoundland in more ways than one.

The Georgetown resident and co-driver Peter Wright took third place overall at the Newfoundland Targa Rally in Buchanan's 1967 Acadian Canso Sport Coupe. They also won the modified classic car division.

But two 50-foot long skid marks on the road near Placentia served as a reminder of how easily things can go wrong when you're driving around streets and highways at 120 km/h.

Buchanan had to lock up the brakes after a previous car clipped a route marker. Still, he managed to stay on course.

Fortunately, the brakes were in

working order. Buchanan drove the first three days of the sevenday rally with a falty master brake cylinder that was replaced after a long search.

He also had to get creative on the fifth day to stay in the race. Realizing he wouldn't have enough gas to complete the day's final stage, residents came to the rescue bringing Buchanan gas from their lawn mowers to get him through.

Buchanan finished the rally with just 53 seconds in penalties, edging a team from Minnesota for third by three seconds. The winners from California accumulated 38 seconds in penalties and just 29 seconds separated the top six teams.
