Region to get \$1M to fight homelessness

The federal government recently announced Halton Region will receive a little more than \$1 million over the next three years toward fighting homelessness.

Halton has consistently advocated for federal government funding support for homelessness initiatives. This funding, which brings the region's total allocation since 2001 to a little more \$2 million will enable Halton to continue to address homelessness through a flexible community-based approach.

The new money is part of a \$405 million investment the federal government committed in its last budget for a national homelessness initiative. Halton received \$1 million in 2001 to support community efforts to alleviate homelessness.

Between January 2001 to March 2003, eight projects were funded which addressed the community's most urgent priorities, including: 14 transitional beds for families were created across the region; 20 new beds were added to Halton Women's Place in Burlington for women fleeing abusive situations and their children, and funds were allocated for the establishment of Halton's first permanent emergency shelter in Oakville for single men and women and youth.

Other groups received funding to research and report on best practices in addressing homelessness, to increase public awareness about homelessness in Halton and to develop a resource guide to accessible housing in Halton for individuals with physical disabilities and their families.
