## No butts about it—legion has smoking ban

Shave to butt out until Halton Hills council votes on whether to reconsider its smoking bylaw— and that vote isn't expected until early 2004.

Councillor Moya Johnson brought it to council's attention at Monday night's meeting that legion members resumed smoking at all times when council deferred to January the legion's request to allow smok-

ing there.

Clerk Karen Landry confirmed the current bylaw is still in place— no smoking allowed until after 9 p.m.

"Under no circumstances did we put the bylaw aside so that people could not follow it," Johnson warned. "It's expected the bylaw to be followed ... and if it is broken then a complaint can be made and enforcement will follow."

## Leash-free zone up and running at Prospect Park

Halton Hills first leash-free zone for dogs is now in operation at Prospect Park in Acton. Fencing and signs have been installed in a section of the park. An official opening ceremony will not be held until the spring.

The zone is a collaborative effort between the town's Recreation and Parks Department and HH-Dog, a citizens' group of dog owners.

According to the town's bylaw, all dogs are required to be on a leash when on public property, except in this zone.


