

# Laise nets five markers as Raiders rout Chargers

Vince Laise skated to the bench and asked, "Did you get my fourth goal puck?"

"Don't worry about it," came the reply from Georgetown Raider assistant coach Peter Mavroudis. "We'll get your fifth."

Mavroudis had reason to be confident. With the game not even half over, the Raider captain had already scored four times to give his team a 7-1 lead in Tuesday's Provincial Jr. A Hockey League game. Could one more be that much harder?

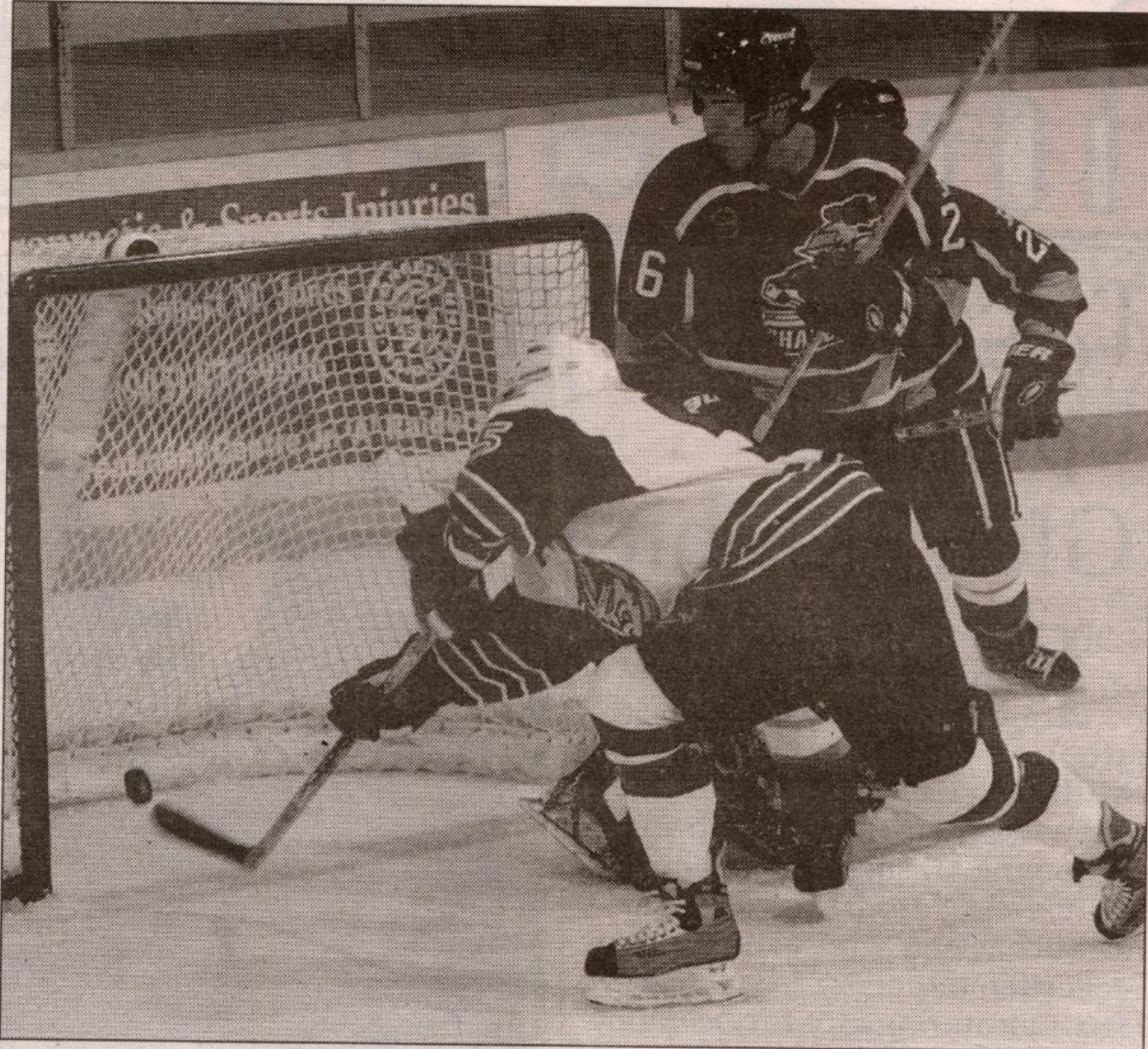
As it turned out it was. It wasn't until the game's final minute that Laise, parked at the edge of the crease, backhanded Daryl Knowles' rebound into the Mississauga Chargers' net to cap a 12-3 Raider victory.

"I actually had a pretty bad warmup but it all came together during the game," Laise said. "It feels pretty good. I've got a smile on my face."

The smile probably had something to do with a six-game goal-less drought coming to an end as well. Laise had just two goals, both in an overtime win over Hamilton, in 10 games before hitting the jackpot Tuesday.

"I've been working hard and putting shots on net," he said. "Then tonight...when it rains it pours."

Skating on a new line with Knowles and Ryan Del Monte cer-

tainly didn't bother Laise.

"This team has such depth. You can't look at it as first line, second line, third line. It's more first, first, second."

That makes it a lot easier for the Raiders to mix lines as they did Tuesday. Not that they really needed a shake-up, with the team averaging more than seven goals a game.

What the Raiders may have been looking for is a more effective way to shut down the opposition. Of the top two teams in each of the four conferences, Georgetown's 3.82 goals against is the highest. But as long as they're scoring in double figures, they can afford to keep working out the defensive

bugs.


Ross Smith scored twice giving him a team-leading nine goals and Matt Velten scored his first Jr. A goal. Arron Alphonso, Frank Burgio, Rick Varone and Mike Gurtler had the other goals. Varone, Knowles and Ryan Del Monte each had three assists.

The Raiders, now 9-0-2 on the season, will face the second-place Oakville Blades on Saturday. The Blades are 8-1-1 and tied the Raiders in their only previous meeting.

"That's a huge game," Laise said. "Being undefeated, every team is looking at us and wants to knock us down."


