## Region adopts idle-free policy in effort to cut down on smog

alton Region is doing its part to cut down the amount of smog-Lcausing exhaust fumes from vehicles that dirty our air.

The region started a new idle-free policy last Monday. It calls for regional vehicles to be turned off if a person will be away from it for more than three minutes while visiting any one of the 30 buildings operated by Halton, like wastewater treatment plants.

The policy also extends to regional employees who use their own vehicles while at Halton building sites, as well as to the public and trucks dropping off deliveries.

The idle-free policy was created in May by Halton Partners for Clean Air, a group comprised of municipalities, school boards, hydro utilities and Conservation Halton to address smog issues. The policy was brought forward by the region's public health department and endorsed by Halton's senior staff.

It didn't require a regional council vote to be enacted.

The primary reason for starting the idle-free policy in the fall was to remind everyone that smog is a year-round concern and not simply a danger in the summer months when it's at its worst, said Becky Jas, an environmental health specialist with the region.

"We want to set an example for the community," she said.

Motorists will see at a dozen or so regional sites a metal sign asking them to, "Turn engine off, spare our air."

Jas said these signs will be posted at Halton sites that have higher traffic volumes and more employees to maximize their message.

Smog is a problem especially for municipalities with urban populations. Oakville suffers some of the poorest air quality in the GTA in the summer.

Health Canada estimates more than 5,000 Canadians die prematurely each year because of air pollution.

Halton is among a few Ontario municipalities that have adopted an idle-free policy to help clean the air. Similar polices exist in Waterloo Region and Owen Sound.

Some municipalities have gone a step further and created an idle-free bylaw, including Oakville. It's bylaw requires vehicles to be shut off after five minutes of idling or risk a fine of \$200.

Halton Chair Joyce Savoline who is also a member of the region's health and social services committee, said the idle-free policy makes sense.

She said bettering air quality is part of the region's strategic plan and the idlefree policy is any easy way in helping achieve that.

"It's not a very complicated way to reduce air pollution," Savoline said.


